Program Co-Chairs

Eric T. Olsen has practiced in the area of wetland regulation since 1990. He has been involved in the development of regulations governing environmental resource permitting, mitigation banking, wetland delineation and consumptive use. He represents clients before the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection.

Ann M. Redmond is an authority on wetland regulation, with special expertise in watershed and ecosystem scale permitting, cumulative impact assessments, development of functional assessment methods, all aspects of wetland mitigation and wetland policy. She was with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection for 12 years and served as Vice President of Development for Wetlandsbank.

Constance J. Bersok has been working with Florida's wetlands since 1987. She is currently the administrator of Florida Department of Environmental Protection's mitigation and mitigation banking program.

Dorothy Boardman has been with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers since 1988. She specializes in environmental and regulatory law and litigation. She has taught Regulatory Enforcement for the Corps.

Richard W. Cantrell is responsible for overseeing the Department's Bureau of Mine Reclamation, with a staff of 50 full-time employees, and the Department's Office of Submerged Lands and Environmental Resource Permitting.

Royal C. Gardner focuses on environmental and international law. From 1989 to 1993, he served in the Army General Counsel's office as the Department of the Army's principal wetland attorney, advising the Assistant Secretary of the Army (Civil Works).

Eric Hickman is responsible for ensuring state-wide coordination and consistency in the delineation of surface waters and wetlands. He provides training and guidance in implementing methodology to departments, districts and local governments.

Mary Lindgren has more than 10 years' experience in environmental site planning, natural resources management and wetlands mitigation. She specializes in wetland mitigation planning.

Frank E. Matthews has developed an extensive regulatory practice and established himself as an expert in environmental/land use law. He specializes in wetlands and surface water permitting.

Kathryn Mennella is the General Counsel of the SJRWMD and has represented SJRWMD for 20 years. She was part of the legislative work group that drafted the permit streamlining provisions of the Florida Environmental Reorganization Act of 1993.
