From the Principal

Thank you for your patience during our major building work. The result of this work means we will have eight refurbished classrooms, four new classrooms and an opportunity to maximise the new outdoor spaces once the old buildings are removed.

Removal and replacement of classrooms will start after the Easter break. Two classrooms and the old music room will be readied for final removal which will take place during the next school holidays. The classrooms on the field will be moved into the middle school area to replace the old classrooms also during the holidays.

The senior classrooms are now benefiting from heat pumps to ensure they stay cool during the remainder of summer and warm in winter. Classrooms across the school will also be getting new furniture to replace old and worn out desks and tables.

Clearway Signs on Udys Road

Many of you may recall we previously had signs outside the school indicating clearway times and areas. This helped not only with traffic flow but the safety of all students and families.

Walking School Bus

The walking school bus programme is in the final stages of completion. A special thank you to Miss Christina Kneebone, Mrs Adele Saville and Vicky Mailei from Auckland Transport for their efforts to make this a reality. This is scheduled to be fully functioning by the end of Term 1 with four different walking buses operating.

Travelwise

Mrs Adele Saville took four students to the Travelwise course in Papatoetoe facilitated by Auckland Transport. The students and Mrs Saville worked collaboratively discussing the issues and barriers we have at Pakuranga Heights School



around road safety at both our zebra crossings. The Travelwise group will work throughout the year with Mrs Saville to present ideas at values/team/full school assemblies and then implement these practical ideas to keep our children safe when travelling to and from school.

Cool Schools- Peer mediators

The Cool Schools Peer Mediation Programme is a whole school programme for Primary and Intermediate Schools that teaches essential life skills for peaceful conflict resolution. It is suitable for all members of the school community; students, teachers and parents. The skills taught empower individuals to build positive, caring relationships with others especially when conflict arises over differences.

Teachers have been teaching the Cool School Lessons during Term 1 to build students' understanding on what is conflict and how to deal with it in a positive way. Also what is mediation, and the skills a mediator must have.

In Term 2 students can apply to be mediators and Miss Christina Kneebone will train the students. They will then start their playground mediating role.

Physical Education- Health and Well-Being

Sport's gear is now being issued to students by the monitors at lunch time. Extra sport's equipment out at lunch time keeps students busy and active having a positive flow on effect with behaviour and general well-being.

Reading Resources

The school is investing \$25,000 in new readers this year. Each book costs between \$12 to \$15 so we will be upgrading the way we manage these resources to reduce the amount lost or damaged. If you find any school readers that may have fallen behind the bed, bookshelves or under car seats please return to your child's teacher or the office.


