What is Mental Health First Aid?

First Aid is the help given to an injured person before medical treatment can be obtained. Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is the help given to someone developing a mental health problem or in a mental health crisis. The first aid is given until appropriate professional treatment is received or until the crisis resolves.

What is the Standard Mental Health First Aid course?

The Standard MHFA course is based on the international MHFA Guidelines. These guidelines were developed using the consensus of mental health consumers, carers and professionals from English-speaking developed countries. Further information under the 'Resources' menu of the MHFA website.

Course Content

The MHFA course teaches members of the public how to assist someone who is developing a mental health problem or in a mental health crisis.

Developing mental health problems covered:

- Depression
- Anxiety problems
- Psychosis
- Substance use problems

Mental health crises covered:

- Suicidal thoughts and behaviours
- Non-suicidal self-injury
- Panic attacks
- Traumatic events
- Severe psychotic states
- Severe effects from alcohol or other drug misuse
- Aggressive behaviours

Participants will learn the signs and symptoms of these mental health problems, where and how to get help and what sort of help has been shown by research to be effective.

Course Format

This is a 12-hour course (4 modules, each 3 hours). The delivery format is flexible.

Course participants receive a copy of the MHFA Manual to keep and a Certificate of Completion.



About MHFA Australia

The Mental Health First Aid Program was developed in 2000 by Betty Kitchener and Prof Tony Jorm and operates within Mental Health First Aid Australia, a national notfor-profit organisation (based in Melbourne) focused on mental health training and research.

MHFA has been well evaluated and found to be effective in improving mental health literacy, reducing stigma and increasing helping behaviours.
