

To help you with your learning, the Learning Resource Centre has 100 netbooks for loan.

All PCs have internet, email and Microsoft packages, plus electronic resources allowing you to access relevant and up-to-date information, online databases, e-books and online reference material.

All students attend an induction that is tailored to their learning needs and the studying/research they will be undertaking.

Daily newspapers and journals are also available, plus photocopying, scanning and printing facilities.

#### **Sport Facilities**

The College has state of the art facilities including a fitness suite, a full sized sports hall and outdoor pitches, modern changing facilities and the latest fitness testing equipment, including high specification fitness Pro Wellness Technology.

Students will be offered the opportunity to take part in sporting activities, with a view to improving their fitness level, muscle tone and exercise technique. #### **Student Services!**

Student Services is open all year round and will provide you with a wide range of information and support. Make this your first port of call for course information, careers advice, welfare advice, financial support and childcare support.

#### **Welfare Advice**

Confidential welfare advice and information on support available outside of college can be arranged by staff within Student Services. A range of activities are organised and advertised around the College or on notice boards.

#### **Student Mentoring**

The College has mentors who are available to support students when they need it most. The mentor team can help students work through a variety of problems which may be preventing them from achieving at college, including personal, financial, social or learning related issues. Support and encouragement is given to help every student to succeed.

#### **Careers Advice**

Advice and guidance is available from Student Services and Connexions. They are able to give impartial advice and guidance about further and higher education, workbased learning and employment, including help with job searches and university applications. In addition, you will also get on-going advice and support from your tutor.

# Additional learning support

The College offers a wide range of support to help students succeed on their course. All full-time students take an assessment of their literacy and numeracy skills – so any problems can be highlighted and an extra tutor can be provided for one-to-one sessions or for individual help.

The Learning Development Support Workers are experienced in working with students with dyslexia, dyscalculia and other specific learning needs. As well as providing extra tutor support within vocational areas, the College also has a team of Learning Support Assistants who can help in classes with note-taking, task focus, concentration and mobility issues.

Also available is a fully-equipped care room with a tracking hoist and a changing bed.

It is our aim, wherever possible, to meet students' needs and help them to succeed on their chosen course. The more information we have about what you need, the more effective we can be – so if you think we can help, get in touch as soon as you can!

If you feel that you may need to access any of these services, please state this on your application form so that we can make sure your requirements are assessed.

# Parents & guardians

The welfare, happiness and success of our students is our primary concern and we know it's what parents/guardians want too. That's why we keep parents/guardians fully informed.

For parents/guardians, we are able to offer information, advice and guidance regarding their son/daughter's progress and the opportunity to discuss these matters directly at parents/guardians' evenings and through students' reports.

All students have a personal tutor and are supported by Student Services with access to individual advice and support, welfare advice, learning support and careers guidance. In addition, all full-time students will have regular group and individual tutorials with their personal tutor as well as their own individual learning plans with targets for their learning.

The College recognises the transition from school to college isn't always easy and that the individual care and attention given to support student progress is vital if they are to succeed. To assist with this process

the College has a Transition Mentor, who works in schools with Year 10 and 11 students.

Student Mentors also work across the College with students who may, for whatever reason, be struggling with college work or life in general. They are able to work with students to help overcome any problems which may be preventing them from achieving their full potential.



# University without A Levels

Redcar & Cleveland College recognises that the traditional academic route to university through A Levels isn't right for everyone.

Students completing a BTEC Extended Diploma Level 3 course (equivalent to three A Levels) can now move on to a relevant degree level course. This could be studied part-time at the College's newly opened Higher Education Centre and is also a recognised entry qualification for most universities in the country.

#### **Passport**

Teesside University's Passport scheme is delivered in partnership with Redcar & Cleveland College to encourage and support progression to higher education. Passport members have the opportunity to sample university life, receive invitations to discovery days and other events covering careers, finance and student support.

Students who fully participate in the Passport scheme will qualify for nomination for the annual Passport Pride Awards.

# Qualifications explained

#### **Diplomas**

The Diploma is a qualification which combines theoretical study with practical experience. It is designed to equip young people for the fast changing world they are growing up in. The Diploma requires students to achieve a minimum standard in English, Maths and ICT, complete a project, do a minimum of 10 days work experience and study a principal subject area. Diplomas are at three levels: Foundation (Level 1), Higher (Level 2) and Advanced (Level 3).

#### **City & Guilds**

City & Guilds offers work related qualifications which give the skills to actually do a job. There is a major focus on learning practical skills. Assessment can take the form of online multiple choice tests, assignments or written exams.

#### **CACHE**

CACHE offers qualifications in the care and education of young people. They are a starting point for those looking for a career as a nanny, childminder, nursery nurse, nursing assistant, teaching assistant, playleader or playworker.

#### **BTEC Entry Level**

BTEC Entry Level qualifications provide students with the initial skills in their chosen subjects, as well as the self confidence they need in work and in everyday life. BTEC Entry Certificates are designed for students with learning difficulties or those who struggle with traditional learning.

#### **BTEC Diploma Level 1**

BTEC Level 1 qualifications offer an entry point to an industry sector, encouraging the development of personal and work-related skills.

The qualifications are designed for those who are not able to achieve A\*-C grade GCSEs, but who are motivated by a work related course.

#### **BTEC Diploma Level 2**

BTEC Level 2 qualifications are the equivalent of traditional GCSEs grade A\*-C. They are designed for those who are capable of achieving A\*-C grade GCSEs, but who wish to focus on a work related vocational qualification or work area.



#### **BTEC Extended Diploma**

BTEC Extended Diplomas are twoyear Level 3 qualifications that are focused on both practical and theoretical study and are equivalent to three A Levels. They are available in a wide range of subjects and can be used to gain access to university.

#### **NVQ Diplomas (National Vocational Qualification)**

NVQs are job specific qualifications that can be taken at a number of levels. NVQs show employers that you have received training and have reached a certain level of skill in your chosen area.

#### VTCT

VTCT is the specialist awarding body for the hairdressing and beauty sector. VTCT offers young people full qualification packages covering complementary therapies, sports and active leisure and business skills.

#### **Functional Skills**

All full-time students will take the new Functional Skills qualifications in English, Maths and/or IT. These are also available on a stand-alone basis. Functional Skills range from Entry Level through to Level 2. The level you are entered for will be determined by past achievements and initial/diagnostic assessment.

#### **Apprenticeships: real skills** for the real world

Apprenticeships are designed to provide young people with relevant, practical training which will enable them to progress within their chosen industry. Apprentices are recruited just as any other employee of the company and paid a wage or a training allowance. An Apprenticeship is a work-based programme with a strong emphasis on practical training and assessment that is truly valued by employers. This includes NVQ at Level 2, the technical qualification and key/functional skills as appropriate.

#### **Advanced Apprenticeships**

Advanced Apprenticeships provide a high-quality route into work for school leavers. They are an alternative to A Levels. Each Advanced Apprenticeship offers a young person the chance to take a National Vocational Qualification (NVQ) at Level 3 and specific key skills. Additionally, the Apprenticeship may include other requirements based on what the individual employer regards as important for the young person and for their business.

# The Foundation Learning Employability Programme (Training & Skills for Work)

# **NOCN Training and Skills** for Work

#### What's it all about?

The NOCN Training and Skills for Work programme offers a range of short courses which have been designed for young people who are unemployed or not clear what career route they want to pursue. The course provides an opportunity to develop skills and knowledge that will support job applications and employability prospects. The course includes Employability Skills, English, Maths and study in one vocational area or a work placement.

#### What do I need?

All applicants must display an interest in progressing employability skills and studying in a vocational area or work experience.


#### How long will it take?



# **Art & Design**BTEC Diploma Level 1

#### What's it all about?

This is a course for students who want a basic introduction to working in the sector and would perhaps like further opportunities for study, such as the Art & Design BTEC Diploma Level 2.

#### What do I need?

No formal entry requirements are needed for this qualification, although students will need to attend an interview.

How long will it take? One year.

What successful students may go on to do:

Art & Design BTEC Diploma Level 2.



# **Art & Design**BTEC Diploma Level 2

#### What's it all about?

This one-year full-time course provides a direct route onto the Art & Design BTEC Extended Diploma Level 3 course. It is a genuine alternative to the traditional GCSE route, and gives students the opportunity to experience the full breadth of design disciplines.

#### What do I need?

Applicants must achieve four GCSEs at grade D-E or above or equivalent, to be discussed at interview. You may also be asked to provide evidence of your design abilities through a portfolio of art and design work at interview.

How long will it take? One year.

What successful students may go on to do:

Art & Design BTEC Extended Diploma Level 3.

#### **Art & Design**

BTEC Extended Diploma Level 3

(Equivalent to 3 A Levels)

#### What's it all about?

The course gives an established university entry qualification and will also provide the pathway into a range of exciting careers including:

- Graphic Design
- Computer Animation
- Textiles
- Interior Design
- Fine Art

You will develop conceptual and practical skills in: Drawing; Painting; Printmaking; Photography; Ceramics; Sculpture; Installation; Animation; Graphic Design; and Human Scale Design.

#### What do I need?

Four GCSEs at grade C or above, including English, or a BTEC Level 2 Diploma in Art & Design (with merit average). You will also need a portfolio of art and design work to provide evidence of your abilities at interview.

# How long will it take? Two years.

## What successful students may go on to do:

With this qualification, you can progress to:

- Higher education at a university to study a Foundation Degree or a Degree, such as BA in Graphic Design or Fine Art
- A specialist area of employment within the art and design industry, such as:
  - Graphic Design
  - Design and Marketing
  - Computer Games Design
  - Product Design
  - Interior Design
  - Design and Crafts for the Entertainment Industry
  - Fine Art.

# **Construction**BTEC Diploma Level 1

#### What's it all about?

This course will develop the personal skills and qualities needed for working and learning to help students achieve their full potential. #### **Beauty Therapy**

City & Guilds Diploma Level 3

#### What's it all about?

The course covers: facial and body electricals; head and body massage; retail and finance; epilation; and aromatherapy using pre-blended oils. You will gain practical experience in TS10, our commercial beauty salon, which simulates a real work environment.

We informally interview each applicant as our main concern is that you will benefit from, and successfully complete, the chosen programme of study. The course is timetabled around family/work commitments and consists of up to 15 hours of study per week.

#### What do I need?

- Beauty Therapy Diploma Level 2
- Formal interview
- Participation in a vocationally related trade test.

#### How long will it take? One year.


