

<u>PREP TERM 2 – AVAILABLE FOR ALL PUPILS EVERY DAY!</u>

Prep is now available every day for all pupils from 3.30pm to 4.30pm. Please encourage your son to attend on a voluntary basis where he can complete his homework in a quiet, relaxed and supervised environment with resources on hand. All Prep rooms have a member of staff available to help pupils with their homework.

Last year many pupils used voluntary Prep sessions in the lead up to internal tests, controlled assessments and exams and also to complete a particular homework where they perhaps needed some guidance and support. With voluntary Prep pupils do not necessarily need to stay for the full hour – once they have completed what they set out to do they can leave the session.

Prep is intended to be a supportive activity that will not only help your son to complete homeworks thoroughly with supervision and on time but it also helps to eliminate the "have you done your homework?" scenario at home which can at times create stress for both parent and child. Completing homework at school also frees up some time in the evening for your son to pursue his extra-curricular activities.

"SHOW MY HOMEWORK"

Your son should now be fully in tune with SMHW and using it on a daily basis to plan and prioritise his homework. Please try to monitor his activity with your own log in as all homework for Term 2 will be set on SMHW and your son's teachers will be using it to record submissions and missed homeworks which will appear on his and your home page.

CCF EXERCISE WARRIOR CADET 2014

Cadets from the Combined Cadet Force spent the Half Term holiday battling mercenaries at Scraesdon Fort in Cornwall as the senior cadets were tested on their leadership skills and tactics. Their task was to protect a witness and secure the Fort to allow the witness to be evacuated to safety.

The Fort dates back to Victorian times and has hundreds of rooms inside linked by steep staircases that were cleared by the lead section. The cadets slept in the old artillery positions overnight as they planned a series of operations to recover supplies dropped by parachute, dominate the ground and conduct close target reconnaissance patrols of the enemy positions. This culminated in a dawn assault as the platoon fought through multiple buildings as they broke into the upper areas of the fort.

The cadets all worked incredibly hard rising to any challenge thrown at them on this particularly arduous exercise that tested all cadets both mentally and physically. The cadets will now be preparing for Remembrance Sunday and the Centenary event to be held at Beechen Cliff School on Tuesday 11th November 2014 at 6.00pm.


This week we welcome two members into the Millionaire's Club – pupils who have read at least 1,000,000 words on AR this year:

EXAMINATIONS

TRIAL EXAMS AND STUDY LEAVE – MONDAY 17TH NOVEMBER 2014 – FRIDAY 21ST NOVEMBER 2014

Your son will be starting his Trial Examinations on Monday 17th November 2014 and these will continue up to and including Friday 21st November 2014.

These trial examinations are a vital step in our preparations for the forthcoming GCSE examinations and we are sure you will wish to give your son additional support and guidance at this potentially stressful time.

Please see the Trial Exam timetable overleaf, which is also displayed on the "Exams" section of the School website. Students should use this to plan their revision.

Tutors will also be discussing the timetable with all students before the exams commence.

Normal timetable for Year 11 will be suspended for this week. Students will be sitting one or two exams each day. Alternatively there may a day when your son has no exam. Before exams students are expected to prepare at home; in between exams a Study Room will be provided. There will also be occasions when your son's exams finish before the end of the school day; it is expected that they will return home to study and must leave quietly so as to avoid disturbing other lessons in progress. We will, however, maintain the right to withdraw Home Study in cases where students do not respond appropriately.

Students studying in school between exams must go to, and remain in, Study Rooms during lesson times. These rooms will be clearly displayed on the Exams Notice Board outside the library. **Normal lessons will resume on Monday 24th November 2014 for all boys.**

These apply to all exams regarding conduct and examination conditions and must be strictly adhered to at all times. If a student fails to follow these guidelines they may be removed from the examination hall and disqualified from the examination series. Please ensure your son is familiar with the regulations, which are set by the Examination Boards. As with all exam seasons students are expected to wear full school uniform at all times.

Mobile telephones, iPods and all electronic devices are <u>not allowed</u> in the Examination Hall and must remain in bags which will be stored in the changing rooms, or should be left in student lockers. Whilst we will take every effort to ensure the changing rooms are locked, Beechen Cliff School waive all responsibility for any loss or damage incurred to this expensive equipment if brought onto school property.

All candidates will sit their examinations in the main examination hall, including those candidates with extra time. Those requiring a scribe, reader or laptop will be contacted by the SEN department regarding the accommodation provided during exams.

The results from these examinations are critical in our assessment of the students for the forthcoming GCSEs. Any unsuitable behaviour during an exam will be dealt with strictly and in the first instance the student will be removed and will sit all further exams in the Headmaster's Study. Serious incidents of disruptive behaviour may result in the School deciding to withdraw a student from all future public examinations.

Results from these examinations will form the basis of the decision regarding public exam entries and a Formal Results Assembly will be held on Friday 5th December 2014when your son will be presented with his results and an early indication of his likelihood of acceptance into Beechen Cliff Sixth Form.

Parents will then have the opportunity to discuss these results with subject teachers at Year 11 Parents Evening on Monday 8th December 2014.




YEAR 9 RUGBY BEECHEN CLIFF SCHOOL 22 ABINGDON 12
