Jesus looked beyond the sinfulness of the woman to see her capacity for love, tenderness, and faith.

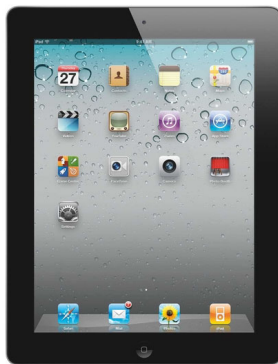

They cannot accept Jesus' power to forgive because they cannot accept the woman as one who chooses to repent and seek forgiveness.

Jesus confronts Simon's self-righteousness and judgment about the woman.

Jesus also confronts us when we make unloving choices. In all these interactions,

Jesus is inviting us to embrace the love which establishes the kingdom of God among us!

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I have been asked “How can someone receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick if they are not in imminent danger of death?” My initial answer is very simple. This sacrament is not the same as “Last Rites.” Since Vatican II anyone may receive this sacrament who is “seriously impaired by illness or old age.” Anointing after death is forbidden because the soul is gone, therefore the rite benefits no one.

However, when someone is approaching death, and they understand and accept it as Jesus did, “Father! Into your hand I place my spirit,” they may request a final anointing and **Viaticum**.

There are actually three sacraments to these last rites of the Church:

Reconciliation, Anointing, and Eucharist. As we understand the first two, they are sacraments for healing the soul before



surrendering totally to God in our final hours. What about

Eucharist? *Viaticum* literally means food for the journey. In the ancient Greek and Roman cultures, coins were placed in the mouth of a dead person to pay Charon, the ferryman, for the journey across the River Styx into the underworld. For Catholics, the Blessed Sacrament is that coin. We send off our dying with the gift of Life, Himself. The gift is not to pay



for safe passage, rather “food for passage through death to eternal life. . .the completion and crown of Christian life on this earth, signifying that the Christian follows the Lord to eternal glory and the banquet of the heavenly kingdom.” (*Pastoral Care of the Sick*, 175) The “last rites” are a renewal of baptism, through which we first entered into the death and resurrection of Christ. If there is not time for penance-anointing-viaticum, viaticum takes precedence. In fact there are some theologians who argue strongly that the real “sacrament of the dying” is *Viaticum*.

I hope this clears up any confusion you might have.

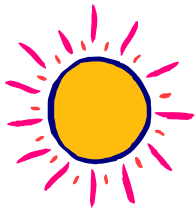
