The International Alliance of Women (IAW) is a non-governmental, feminist organisation, which embraces both women's groups and individuals. The basic principle of the IAW is Equal Rights - Equal Responsibilities. The decision for the establishment of our organisation was taken in Washington in 1902. The Alliance was formally constituted in Berlin in 1904. The IAW represents more than 50 organisations world-wide and has attracted many individual members. The IAW has consultative status to the United Nations Economic and Social Council and participatory status with the Council of Europe. The IAW has permanent representatives in New York, Vienna, Geneva, Paris, Rome, Nairobi, Bangkok and Strasbourg and is influencing the EU through its membership to the Women's Lobby in Brussels.

- to secure all such reforms as are necessary to establish a real equality of liberties, status and opportunities between women and men, and to work for equal partnership between women and men in all spheres of life
- to urge women to accept their responsibilities and to use their rights and

The IAW uses its influence to formulate, develop and implement policies concerning the equality of the sexes at a global, regional and national level. The IAW actively lobbies through its representatives in international organisations, its delegations at important multilateral meetings, its affiliates in many countries of the world and its individual members.

Women's rights are human rights. Human rights are universal, indivisible, interdependent and interrelated.

The IAW affirms that full and equal enjoyment of human rights -as laid down in treaties, conventions and declarations -is due to all women and girls.

The IAW maintains that a prerequisite to securing these rights is the universal ratification and implementation without reservation of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW). It urges its members to pressure their governments to ratify the Optional Protocol to CEDAW. The importance and value of women's contribution as equal partners has been acknowledged at the numerous United Nations world conferences held from 1975 through to the present time. Of particular relevance for women is the

implementation of the 1995 Beijing Platform for Action, as reconfirmed in 2000 and 2005, to which 189 member states have committed themselves.

The IAW calls on its members to monitor the fulfilment of these commitments. After more than 100 years the Alliance faces dramatic new challenges to its goal of achieving equal rights and equal responsibilities for women. Today, as it was in the beginning of this Alliance, peace is important for women, both as sufferers of non-peace and as suppliers of skills in keeping peace.
