Student Graduation Project Forbes Road Junior-Senior High School

Beginning with the Class of 1999, new state and school district regulations require you to complete a major project in order to earn your diploma. The regulations say students will "apply, analyze, synthesize and evaluate information and communicate significant knowledge and understanding." The persistence to stay with a major project through to completion and the ability to focus on specific decisions along the way are viewed as important qualities to be developed and demonstrated during the Senior Project.

Most important is the idea that such projects will be of great benefit to you in the personal satisfaction of pursuing an area of interest, of "owning' a body of work, of demonstrating expertise, of exploring vocational and vocational possibilities, and of expanding personal knowledge. The project is an opportunity to apply and synthesize previous knowledge in ways perhaps never before experienced, to contribute to or serve the community and society, and to have a real-life experience.

Definition of Project

The Student Project is a major undertaking that is expected to be started during your freshman year. It is to be completed no later than the end of the first semester of your senior year. It will require personal initiative on your part. Each student will be required to complete 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th grade requirements (see senior project outline).

Community Service Hours

Student will need to complete and sign the Proposal Form, included in this Handbook. Obtain the signatures and submit the Form to the Office of the Dean of Students for approval.
