SESSION I – June 25, 26, 27 and 28th



Super Summertime Artists (Rising 2nd – 4th graders)

Session I 8:30 – 12:15

Let's get messy and create art! This course will offer a variety of arts & crafts for each day of the program. Students will create a clay project to paint, dragon box puppets, weaving, watercolors or mosaics.

Read Naturally – Computer Based Reading Program for at Risk Readers (reading at grade 2 – 3 and in grade 3 or 4)

Session I 8:30 – 12:15

This program is designed for at risk readers reading below grade level (students currently in grade 3 and 4 and reading on a second or third grade level) and need continued reading practice. The five elements identified by the **National Reading Council**: phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension are key components of this 10 step computer-based reading program. This intervention program combines teacher modeling, repeated reading, and progress monitoring – three strategies that research has shown are effective in improving students' reading proficiency. Using audio support and graphs of their progress, students work with high-interest material at their level using computer based learning. Additional skill building will be provided.

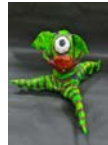

We will learn to use viewfinders and other techniques to achieve accurate proportion and perspectives. Students will learn how to suggest textures found in nature and build forms from shadows and highlights. We will also explore various media, such as watercolor, pastels, and charcoal. It is recommended that students bring a large (larger than 9x12") sketchbook to class, though all materials will be provided.
