4HOnline Enrollment Deadline Approaching!!

4Honline enrollment forms and dues for all returning 4-H members, leaders and volunteers are to be submitted by **4:30 pm on Tuesday, December 31.** Returning members who register projects after the December 31 deadline will need to appear before the Board of Directors for an exemption to exhibit items from those projects in the Junior Fair. **This is a strict deadline!** The May 1, 2014 enrollment deadline is for youth who have not been 4-H members before. Northern District Winter Camp

4-H members in grades 8-13 who want to spend a fun weekend making new friends, gaining new leadership skills, and participating in winter games and activities will want to attend 4-H Winter Camp, scheduled for January 17-19, 2014 at Camp Crossroads in Bayfield County. The camp offers a variety of outdoor winter activities including tubing, x-country skiing, building snow shelters, and snowshoeing. Cost will be \$75 and includes all meals, activities, and lodging in heated cabins. Remember, all youth who completed ME forms were awarded a scholarship to Winter Camp, but any 4-H member is welcome to participate in Winter Camp, providing they are currently in 8th grade or 14 years of age. Financial Policies

4-H financial policies are available for everyone to read on our website (http://douglas.uwex.edu/4h) under "Forms."

Three main points from these policies are:

- 4-H groups who raise funds or accept donations must have a federal EIN and a checking account at a public financial institution.
- 4-H groups planning a fund raising event or raffle must complete a "Fund Raising Request" form and submit it to the Leader's Association Board for approval at least one month before the fund raising event.
- 4-H groups planning to solicit a business or organization for a donation must complete a "Solicitation Request" form and submit it to the Leader's Association Board for approval.

Upcoming Volunteer Certification

Does your club have new parents or adults interested in becoming 4-H volunteers? Then ask them to join us on Monday, December 9, 11:30 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. at the Extension Office for 4-H certification and training. Feel free to bring a sack lunch! Certified volunteers are covered by liability insurance, may host 4-H guests, transport youth other than their own to/from 4-H activities, and work one-on-one with 4-H youth during meetings. They also have access to project literature, support from 4-H educators and specialists, and can participate in or chaperone workshops and other events. This workshop will be offered again on January 20, 2014 in conjunction with Project Night at Northwestern High School. These are the only scheduled certification sessions scheduled for 2013-2014.

Volunteer Annual Training

Please note that the Annual Leader Training that typically occurs in May, is now a series of 4 webinars. Each club needs to have at least one leader attend this training in order to meet the chartering requirements. This year, 4-H is offering an E-Forum "Leadership Flight Plan" that includes 4 different sessions – if you are attending, you can choose the topic that interests you, makes the most sense for your club, or works best with your schedule. The dates of the remaining session are January 14th and February 3rd, 2014 from 7-8:30 p.m. The sessions will all be held at the Extension Office Conference Room. I'm asking that you "check in" (register) with me at least 24 hours in advance of the training, so I know if anyone is coming. If no one registers, the session will be cancelled.
