Interpreting This Week's Readings

Christ had promised his followers that he would send his Holy Spirit, and today we relive that moment. In the Gospel we see how Jesus breathes on his disciples (as God breathed new life into Adam during creation) and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit." In the first reading, we observe how the Holy Spirit actually descends upon them from the sky, accompanied by the sound of a rushing wind, and "tongues of fire" appeared. (Some early churches celebrated this day by blowing horns and dropping rose petals from the ceiling to symbolize this wind and fire.) Immediately the Holy Spirit enables them to proclaim the good news of Jesus' resurrection in different tongues, so that everyone in the crowd hears his own language. This marks the great "birth of the church" that we celebrate today as Pentecost. In the second reading, we learn that the Holy Spirit gives different gifts to everyone, empowering each of us with the ability to serve God.

Name one gift you have received from the Holy Spirit. How can you use it today?

Do not read this during the Homily By Father Paul Lambert

Goodness, Gracious, Great Balls of Fire!!! Yes, that really was the first thought in mind as I began to dwell upon this great feast of Pentecost: the day in which God set this world on fire through the power of the Holy Spirit. Notice in that short phrase of Jerry Lee Lewis we find a very unintentional, yet fruitful image of God's love inflaming our hearts. Goodness: that the Holy Spirit is pure goodness. Gracious: that it is through the gift of grace, the Holy Spirit that we are united with God the Father and the Son. Great Ball of Fire: an unquenchable and unstoppable force that is God's desire to show His love to us. I heard it once said that when one truly receives God's love it is like trying to drink from a fire hose. Today we celebrate the day in which the Lord used a belt-fed weapon of love to transform this world, the day in which the Church was born. All you have to do is brace yourself for impact. All you have to do is open yourself to the gift the Lord wants to give you today. The same spirit that fell upon the disciples on Pentecost is the same spirit that has been given to each and every one of us in baptism. Let us be renewed in the grace of God's love. The real

questions is: Are you ready for it?
