## 2016 Margaret A. Gannon Legal Education Stipend Application

Purpose. Women Lawyers of Alameda County (WLAC) established the Margaret A. Application. Please email one PDF file that contains: (1) the latest version of your resume including your best contact information; (2) a one-page personal statement (limited to no more than 600 words) describing your professional goals and your involvement with civic and community activities — particularly with law-related organizations, such as WLAC; and (3) include the following language at the bottom of your personal statement, along with your dated signature:

Statement Of Certification. The information given by me on the attached resume and this personal statement is accurate and complete to the best of my knowledge. I understand that all application materials submitted will become the property of WLAC.
