1. <u>HEALTH CARE REFORM</u> thru MEDICAL LIABILITY REFORM by

supporting caps on punitive damages, and other medical liability reforms that ensure fair damage awards, eliminate frivolous lawsuits, and lower costs to providers and patients alike.

2. <u>HEALTH CARE REFORM</u> by allowing <u>Purchasing Plans across state lines</u>: Individuals and small businesses should be allowed to purchase health plans that are not subject to onerous state mandates. The U. S. Chamber of Commerce tells us that the CBO says that this will lower costs while improving choice.

- 6. <u>ADOPT A PRO-GROWTH TAX</u> <u>AGENDA</u> by preventing a complete rollback of the 2001 and 2003 tax cuts.
- ADOPT A PRO-GROWTH TAX <u>AGENDA</u> by Reducing the Budget Deficit through higher economic growth, spending restraint, and entitlement reform, not higher taxes.
- ADOPT A PRO-GROWTH TAX <u>AGENDA by Eliminating</u> or through substantially reform—the alternative minimum tax (AMT) to protect a growing number of individuals and businesses, including many middle-class Americans.

9. ADOPT A PRO-GROWTH TAX AGENDA

by Retooling the corporate tax structure to reduce what is one of the highest marginal corporate income tax rates in the developed world. Reducing corporate tax rates will stimulate economic recovery and attract foreign and domestic investment, which will create American jobs.

- 10. **PROTECT JOBS & A PRO-BUSINESS WORK ENVIRONMENT** by Opposing efforts to revive the "Employee Free Choice Act" which would make union organizing easier by abolishing the secret ballot. (This is also known as the "Card Check" legislation).
- 11. PROTECT JOBS & A PRO-BUSINESS WORK ENVIRONMENT by supporting fair workplace rules that protect workers and promote employer flexibility and economic growth and opposes harmful proposals and burdensome regulations that generate litigation instead of jobs.
- 12. SUPPORT FEDERAL HIGHWAY INFRASTRUCTURE construction especially the completion of Interstate 49 from I-220 to the Arkansas State line. (Governor Jindal just announced state funding for another 4.25 miles - Section J! All we need now is funding for ONE MORE MILE -Section K).
 - 3. SUPPORT FEDERAL HIGHWAY <u>INFRASTRUCTURE</u> by the swift reauthorization of the federal highway and transit programs (SAFETEA-LU), with increased user feebased funding and a new federal role that focuses on national interests, accountability, and project delivery reforms.
