SEL SNAPSHOT

An assumption that is often made is that for students to achieve their potential in all areas of life, they have to work hard at it. If the "it" is something enjoyable or in an area where they have natural talent or aptitude, it is easier for the student to work independently, and thus require less support from parents and teachers. When the "it" is schoolwork or other work that is hard or boring, keeping the right mindset can be a problem.

Persistence is evident when students continue to stay engaged in frustrating or difficult work until it is completed. Your child may show Persistence at home or in the classroom by:

Memorising spelling lists

Finishing Maths problems in a set period of time

Checking written tasks for errors in punctuation

Practicing handwriting

Look for Persistence in your child at home this week, and praise them when you catch them in the act of trying hard and sticking with their work.



Dear Parents

2013 Tuition Fees

The annual review has occurred to determine the level of school tuition fees in 2013. The decision to raise fees is not taken for granted, nor taken without careful consideration of the needs of schools balanced against the capacity of families to contribute.

In 2013 the attached tuition fee schedule will apply for families with children attending primary and secondary schools in the Diocese of Cairns.

Tuition fees cover a variety of expenses including salaries of teaching and non-teaching staff, staff working at Catholic Education Services, and non salary expenditure including superannuation and long service leave. In addition schools incur various forms of non salary expenditure including operating costs, professional development of staff and system development costs.

In the Diocese of Cairns the rationale has been to increase tuition fees by the movement in the Education Index of the Consumer Price Index (as reported by the Australian Bureau of Statistics). For the year ended 31/03/2012 the education index moved by 6.0%. For 2013 the decision has been made to increase tuition fees by 5.5%. The lower than normal increase recognises the wider economic conditions that continues to exist in Far North Queensland.

I appreciate that some families may face financial hardship in meeting fees and levies. It is important that families who want to access Catholic Education for their children are not excluded because they do not have the means to pay fees. It is our policy and practice to assist any family in this situation. If your family may experience genuine financial hardship in paying fees please make contact with the Principal or Parish Priest to discuss fee concessions.

Thank you for your continuing commitment to Catholic Education. We are proud of the quality of our schools and we are keenly aware and grateful of how much parental support we receive, both through payment of tuition fees and levies and so many other forms of generous help.

Thanks very much for all your ongoing support.





Wonder of Living Program

The general feedback relating to last week's Wonder of Living program has been extremely positive. I sat in on a session and was impressed by the presenter's ability to address any issues raised by children in a positive and matter-of-fact manner. Content was presented clearly in a manner consistent with the Catholic Tradition and with an aim to arm students with the information to help them better understand their journey into adulthood. Well done to our presenters from Natural Fertility Services, Mr. John Shay, Mrs. Trish Logan, and Mrs. Dorelle Lo Grande!

THE Value of Forgiveness

When asked by Peter how many time he should forgive someone, suggesting seven as a good number, Jesus responded that seventy-seven times would be more appropriate. This exchange between Peter and Jesus has even more impact if we are in tune with the ancient

Hebrew understanding of seven as a 'perfect number', one that reveals divine activity. Peter thought his suggestion of 'seven' was the perfect response. Jesus however suggested to Peter that he should 'aim higher'. Jesus poignantly demonstrated what such forgiveness might look like from the cross when he was able to extend his forgiveness to those responsible for his crucifixion. We are called to forgive just as Jesus forgave. The act of giving and receiving forgiveness is a visible sign of God's grace. So significant is this call to forgiveness, that the Church has made the celebration of God's forgiveness to those who genuinely seek it a sacramental action. We ritually celebrate this in the Sacrament of Penance (Confession)

The Christian call to forgive extends not just to our friends and family, but to those whose friendship we, for whatever reason, may be actively avoiding. This is not an easy calling, but if we are to build a life giving community, it is a necessary one. This is not to say that the consequences of sinful choices are all negated. Children may still have to weather a lunchtime detention for a poor choice just as adults may still have to face serious

consequences for their sinful choices. Forgiveness does however signal a willingness to work towards repairing any relationship that is damaged by sin.

Typical expressions of forgiveness for our children include:

- Apologising if they hurt someone, even if it's accidental.
- Being willing to accept a meaningful apology when it's offered.
- Letting go of grudges.
- Knowing that paybacks are out.
- Understanding that every day is a new beginning.
- Saying sorry and meaning it.
- Leaving yesterday's baggage behind.
