Father Carey . . .

For the last two and a half years, Father Carey has struggled with many health challenges. Sadly, he has been unable to celebrate Mass since June. While he struggles to retain some mobility that will keep him independent, it will be a continuing challenge for the foreseeable future.



After prayer and consultation, Father Carey asked Bishop Caggiano to grant him early retirement for medical reasons. The Bishop responded favorably to his request and granted him retirement as of October 1. He will remain in residence here at St. Aloysius as long as he is physically able or until additional rooms at our clergy retirement residence in Stamford are completed in early 2016. He will continue to do some limited ministry, depending upon his health.

On behalf of our parish, as well as all of our clergy and staff, I want to thank Father Carey for his 34 years of priestly service. I know that he has helped many during his 13 years at St. Aloysius. We have enjoyed his presence as a brother priest in the rectory. He is a wise friend, always available with humor and encouragement. I know that many have had similar relationships with him. During the last two and a half years, so many have reached out to him and assisted him during some very difficult moments. Please do continue to cultivate these friendships with him, as he will be present to the extent that his health permits. I know he enjoys being with people and am sure he appreciates seeing different faces, other than the three priests with whom he lives.

Please keep Father Carey in your prayers. Like all of us, he depends upon God's help each day to continue his priestly life. We are pleased that he can be present frequently in our parish life. May God be with him and make his burdens light.
