- > Once training request is received and you have been registered, you will receive a confirmation email of your request *Please note*: You will also receive notification if the session is full and you may be advised of other training dates, should any be available.
- Sessions fill up quickly, so it is important for you to submit your request as early as possible.
- There will a sign-in sheet at all training sessions it is important to ensure that you have signed this sheet, so that you can be recognized for attending the training. It also assists with the certificates process (where applicable).
- > GA Training registration forms **must** be completed for all GA training regardless if registering through other process, and sent in to Careen Simoes.
- For CORE, First Aid/CPR, CFSIS/Intake, OSD, Child & Youth Care Worker training programs the registration process is at the end of this calendar.

MOTIVATIONAL INTERVIEWING FOR ANXIETY & DEPRESSION - FULL

This training covers the application of Motivational Interviewing to engage clients experiencing anxiety and related problems.

- To train your ears to identify key MI markers (ambivalence, change talk, taking steps, resistance)
- Key skills in responding to MI markers to move the client productively to resolving ambivalence and enhancing commitment to change
- How to cultivate empathic understanding and use it to enhance intrinsic motivation
- How to manage resistance
- How to move flexibility with clients to blend more supportive and more directive clinical styles
- How to integrate MI with CBT

UNDERSTANDING ACCESS AND REUNIFICATION ISSUES THROUGH AN ATTACHMENT PERSPECTIVE

Moving a child into care addresses issues of physical safety, and this 2 day training will help participants understand what is necessary to address the emotional safety of a child in care. Participants will come away with an understanding of the different attachment patterns in children and in adults, how those act as protective strategies in relationships, and how to determine when a parent/child dyad is moving towards a safer and more secure relationship. We will divide our time between lecture and case examples, including small and large group discussion, moving towards an integration of theory and practice. Participants are invited to bring questions or examples they have encountered in their work- not for supervision, but to gain a deeper understanding. This training is suitable for protection workers, foster care workers, family support workers, or investigative workers.
