Redevelopment plans include housing Safeway anticipating renovation for Ocean Beach store



Located next to Golden Gate Park and a block from Ocean Beach, the LaPlaya Safeway is a handy place to pick up food for a nearby picnic. Safeway has announced that it purchased the La Playa Safeway property in January 2008 and is preparing to work on a total redevelopment of the property to include housing and a new state-ofthe-art Safeway store.

"We are in the preliminary stages, and Safeway believes it is vital to begin a dialogue with the community regarding a vision for the project," said Natalie Mattei, Safeway real estate manager.

Representatives from Safeway will meet with the PAR general

membership on July 23rd to learn how the neighborhood views Safeway's current store and operation and what items are important in a future redevelopment.

"Safeway views this as an informal brainstorming meeting and plans on returning at a future date to review site plans and architectural designs," said Mattei.

The Ocean Beach Safeway, as it is known by many locals, has been a Safeway store since 1971, when it was originally built on the site of the old Playland-at-the-Beach.

Hiking trails offer quick getaways for District residents

Most recently, improvements to the Lands End trail have been completed. Enhancements include an improved handicapped accessible Coastal Trail segment.

Hundreds of bags of invasive weeds have been removed, and 23,500 plants have been installed by volunteers. The parking lot has been graded, and its entrance has been relocated to provide easier access to the trail.
