This past week I have been asked many questions about the separation of church and state, by adults as well as teenagers. This is widely misunderstood and many people have a false understanding of what separation of church and state actually is. I was going to type many definitions and quotes, but that would not be as understandable as a simple explanation. I will begin by a few sentences from the encyclopedia and focus on the truth and the misunderstanding.

"The term "**separation of church and state**" typically refers to a widely repeated liberal falsehood about the Establishment Clause of the First Amendment of the United States Constitution, which actually states:

"Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances."

The term "separation of church and state" actually appears nowhere in the First Amendment, unlike rights explicitly protected therein, such as free exercise of religion, freedom of speech, freedom of the press, and freedom of expressive association. Though absent from the Constitution, "separation of church and state" is seen as being derived from it, and which is interpreted by many liberal law professors and some misguided judges to exclude religion from government by declaring that church and state must be kept separate to an extreme degree."

The actual terms of separation of church and state are not even stated in the First Amendment. The truth, simply stated, is that the government, Federal or individual State, will not establish a religion or identify with any particular religion (unlike like some other countries: Germany is identified with the Lutheran religion, and England with the Anglican religion). At the same time, churches are asked to not endorse a particular candidate by name. This is all there is to the separation. Churches may inform all people of all parties and candidate information, and as long as they include all candidates. For example, if a church wanted to inform people about the upcoming presidential election, as long as all the candidates are mentioned, it is permitted, we are just not allowed to single out one particular candidate and disregard the rest. At the same time, students are allowed to pray in school, and even out loud, as long as it is not led by an employee of the school or a coach. If the students want to get together on their own and pray out loud, they are allowed by law. This applies to other public places as well and for people of all ages. This means that the current understanding by most people about separation of church and state is misunderstood. Many government meetings still begin with prayer. Pastors and church authorities and representatives may inform their people of exactly what candidates believe and stand for as long as they are not endorsing a particular candidate. Providing information is part of our free speech in this country. This has been misunderstood in recent years and replaced with the understanding that the church may not have anything to do with government and visa-versa. This is false! I hope this brief explanation helps with the understanding, and encourages Catholic Christians to be well informed and help others to also be well informed so that our beliefs and morals may be upheld as we enter into the next presidential elections.

This week we continue in the **GOSPEL OF JOHN**, about the Bread of Life discourse where we have been seeing Jesus revealing and teaching us that He is the True Bread from Heaven, giving us His actual Flesh to eat and His Blood to drink in the form of bread and wine. I have shared a few Eucharistic Miracles with you all in the bulletin and homilies over this past year and also, back when I was here as an assistant priest. One of the most recent miracles of the Eucharist happened in 2001 in India and I would like to share the brief summary here. You can read more about it and others at http://www.therealpresence.org/eucharst/mir/engl_mir.htm.

This Eucharistic miracle was verified recently, on May 5, 2001 in Trivandrum, India. In the Host there appeared the likeness of a man's face similar to that of Christ crowned with thorns. His Beatitude (Bishop) Cyril Mar Baselice, Archbishop of the diocese of Trivandrum, wrote regarding this prodigy: "For us believers what we have seen is something that we have always believed. If our Lord is speaking to us by giving us this sign, it certainly needs a response from us." The monstrance containing the miraculous Host is to this day kept in the church.

Let us contemplate this great gift of Jesus, the gift of Himself, and truly give the response Bishop Cyril Mar Baselice speaks of, and that is the total gift of our self back to Him and to others, and never forget that the Eucharist is not just bread and wine as a symbol, but instead it is all of Jesus, His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity, alive in our Church.
