The Royal Chelsea Hospital
on Thursday the 27th of February 2014.*



The Royal Hospital was founded by King Charles II in 1682 as a retreat for veterans. Sir Christopher Wren was commissioned to design and erect the building. Sir Stephen Fox was commissioned to secure the funds necessary to progress the build. Parts of the Royal Hospital Chelsea were heavily damaged, with some loss of life during World War I and after being reconstructed in 1923, the buildings were then destroyed by a V2 rocket in 1945.

One of our own Liveryman Raymond Pearson, a Chelsea Pensioner, will accompany us on the tour.

Nearest Station: - Sloane Square station on the District and Circle Line.
