Schaeffer Institute at Covenant Seminary in St. Louis. He is the author of numerous books including The Heart of Evangelism, Shepherds and Sheep, Who are the Peacemakers? and The Great Rescue. He also co-authored Being Human with Ranald Macaulay. After meeting at Swiss L'Abri, Jerram and his wife Vicki spent several years working at English L'Abri. They have three grown sons.
