Meat goats are goats bred for meat purposes. Does or wethers of any breed will be judged on merits for meat purposes.

2. Goats must have milk teeth in place at the time of fair. Market goats must be less than 1 year of age.
3. Goats must be dehorned or if horned, the horns must be tipped (not less than the diameter of a dime at the end.)
4. Goats must be slick shorn above the knee and hock.
5. Animals are shown with collars or halter and lead in the class. There will be no bracing allowed.
6. Meat goats shown in meat classes cannot be shown in dairy classes and dairy goats shown in the dairy classes cannot be shown in the meat classes.
6. Market classes will be divided by weight. Breeding meat goat classes will be divided by age.
7. Animal required on fairgrounds during fair to be eligible for Showmanship (under 7 years). Management prior to fair not required.

CONTEST REGULATIONS Team entries: The contest may be open to more than one team per county. The teams will be broken up by age categories: Junior, Intermediate, and Senior Teams will consist of 3 members. The oldest member of the team will determine of which age category the team competes. A 15 year old member on a team with two 7 year old members will compete in the senior division. The animal will be assigned a number before the contest and the team will draw a number for the calf assignment. Supplies and equipment will not be provided. Grooming chutes will be provided.

Single individuals will be placed on a team per the discretion of the superintendent. The entry fee will be \$20 per team or \$7 per individual.

CONTEST RULES

1. The completion will be thirty minutes in length. A ten minute warning will be given. At the end of the 30 minute allotted time, clippers down and work stops.
2. An animal will be provided.
3. Each animal must be completely clean and dry.
4. No sawdust or artificial hair can be used.
5. Exhibitors will be judged based upon the following criteria: (A Quality of workmanship (B Team Skills-

Compatibility and Organization.

6. Teams will be required to wash and dry animal before it is returned to the owner.

Prizes: 50 percent of the entry fee will be returned to the 1st place team of each division. Additional prizes may be awarded.
