SECTION 11 Day Bus Policy Ride Charge

It is the policy of the OC Ski Club Inc. that there must be a minimum of 21 passengers in order to run a day bus.

It is the policy of the OC Ski Club Inc. to charge \$10 for members and applicants to ride a Ski Day Bus. It is the policy of the OC Ski Club Inc. to charge \$20 to guests to ride a Ski Day Bus, this includes the required \$5 one day membership. Family members (age 17 and under) are charged the same as the members/applicants, \$10 to ride a Ski Day Bus.

It is the policy that ski day bus leaders will receive a free bus ride on the trip they are running. Revised: 10/6/2011, 12/1/2011, 10/2012, 7/2/2015





