First Communion

Bethlehem Olive Wood Religious Articles

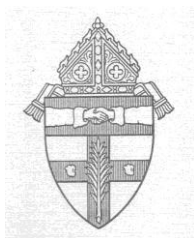
The tradition of making the handicrafts began in the 4th century CE under Byzantine rule in Bethlehem — which continues to be the main city that produces the craft — following the construction of the Church of the Nativity. Greek Orthodox monks taught local residents how to carve olive wood. The art developed and became a major industry in Bethlehem and nearby towns like Beit Sahour and Beit Jala in the 16th and 17th centuries when Italian and Franciscan artisans on pilgrimage to the area — by now under the rule of the Ottomans — taught the residents how to carve. Since then the tradition has been passed on generation by generation and is dominated by the descendants of the original local carvers.

Today, the art continues to be a major source of income for Bethlehem's Palestinian Christian residents and is the most profitable tourist product in the city with the main purchasers being Christian pilgrims visiting in Christmas time. Olive wood branches are supplied by olive groves in nearby villages as well as from the Nablus and Tulkarm region, despite the difficulty of transportation in the West Bank.

Today, more than six hundred Christian families, mostly Catholic, living in Bethlehem rely completely on the hand carved olive wood figures to make their livings. ***Support their cause the weekend of September 24/25; products will be on display for sale after all Masses.***

The Eucharistic Prayer

In our exploration of the various parts of the Eucharistic Prayer, we take a brief look at two changes in the new translation of the Mass. First, while the previous translation of the Words of Institution referred to “the cup” of Christ’s blood, the new translation renders it “the chalice.” This is a more faithful and more formal rendering of the Latin text of the Mass and one that underscores the liturgical nature of this vessel. This is no ordinary cup, but the Eucharistic cup (see Luke 22:20 and 1 Corinthians 11:25) that the Lord consecrated at the Last Supper. This most sacred of vessels has traditionally been called a “chalice,” and so this is the term used in the new translation. Second, the previous translation of the Mass referred to Jesus’ blood having redemptive value “for all.” But the new translation replaces the words “for all” with “for many”:

“FOR THIS IS THE CHALICE OF MY BLOOD,
THE BLOOD OF THE NEW AND ETERNAL
COVENANT,
WHICH WILL POURED OUT FOR YOU AND FOR
MANY
FOR THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS.”

This change in the translation remains closer to Jesus’ actual words of institution in the Gospels (see Matthew 26:28). It is also more harmonious with the Latin text of the Mass and with wording that has been used at this point in the liturgy for centuries. Some people have raised concerns, however, that the words “for many” limit the universal scope of Jesus’ saving mission. It is feared that the new wording gives the impression that Jesus did not die on the cross for everyone – that he offered his blood on Calvary not “for all” but just for a select group of people (“for many”).

However, on a basic level, the new translation points to the reality that while Jesus died for all, not everyone chooses to accept this gift. Each individual must choose to welcome the gift of salvation and live accordingly to this grace, so that he or she may be among “the many” who are described in this text. Moreover, many Scripture scholars have observed that Jesus’ language at the Last Supper about his blood being poured out “for many” recalls “the many” that are three times mentioned in Isaiah 53:11-12. In this prophecy, Isaiah foretold that God one day would send his servant who would make himself “an offering for sin,” pouring out his soul to death and bearing the sin of “many” and making “many” righteous (see Isaiah 53:10-12). Jesus, speaking at the Last Supper about his own blood being poured out “for many,” is clearly associating himself with the Suffering Servant of Isaiah. He is the one coming to die for the “many.” This should not be understood, however, in opposition to the fact that Jesus died “for all” (see 1 Timothy 2:6). The other prophecies in Isaiah about the Servant of the Lord make clear that he has a universal mission, one that announces salvation to *all* humanity (see, for example, Isaiah 42:1-10; 49:6; 52:10). In a sense, the expression “for many” can be seen as contrasting the *one* person who dies – the Lord’s Servant (Jesus) – with *the many* who benefit from his atoning sacrifice.
