You must use textual evidence from *Stargirl* and the nonfiction article(s) read during our unit. You should also include evidence from your own personal experiences.

## Your letter should:

- Have a heading (including name, assignment, ELA 8 Period #, and date)
- Be 2-3 pages in length
- Be in letter format (with a date, greeting, and closing)
- Typed in Times New Roman, 12 point font, and double spaced
- Include citations for any textual evidence used
  - Citations should look like this: (Author's Last Name Page #)
  - Here is an example: (Spinelli 13)
- You DO NOT need a Works Cited page

Please hand in 2 copies of your letter: 1 for grading and the other to deliver to one of the 6th graders in our school.

Use the checklist below to ensure that you have completed all parts of the assignment:

My project
has a heading (including name, assignment name, ELA 8 Period #, and date)

stays on the topic of conformity and peer pressure and has a clear topic sentence or thesis statement regarding this issue

uses evidence from the texts ( <i>Stargirl</i> and nonfiction article) as well as my personal experiences to support my topic sentence and the message of my letter
all textual evidence is cited correctly
has two copies of my letter printed
has been proofread for errors
