There is no charge for the class, but registration is required. Advanced study of *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual* is highly suggested as well as study of the 392 question and answer Technical Class License question pool. Memphis Amateur, 1465 Wells Station Rd, 683-9125 is a local ham radio store that sells the manuals. Barnes & Noble also sell the manuals.

Practice tests are highly recommended. The www.qrz.com website is free. To access the sample tests, scroll down and click on Practice Tests on the left side of the QRZ home page. Another site is www.hamtestonline.com. It costs \$59.95, but it is good for 2 years for the Technician, General and Extra Class tests.

The 35-question FCC exam will be given at the end of class by a Volunteer Examiner (VE) team. There is a \$15.00 ARRL VEC FCC exam fee.

AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE

Many times we work on older equipment or build up circuits from old QST or other magazines. We are always looking for parts to use in the equipment. In the old days tubes were normally in all electronic circuits. Getting parts for these can be harder these days. Companies are online that supply some of these parts for the builder. One of these companies is Radio Daze. They have a variety of older electronics parts for sale. They sell multi-section capacitors, high voltage capacitors, polyester film capacitors, and temp stable mica capacitors. They also sell a complete selection of tubes along with replacement bases for them if needed. They even have solid state replacements for rectifier tubes. They even have replacement dials for some old radios. Radio Daze has tools for restoring radios they sell. They also have a list of publications to help in restoring older radios. They have replacement speaker grill cloth for those old radios that need to be replaced. Radio Daze even offers restoration services to rebuild old speaker cones. AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many times we like to have different keys and paddles to run on our rigs. On the TEN TEC series of QRP rigs they use the RCA type plug in jack for the key. The older Heathkits also use this type of RCA connection. With newer TVs going to HDMI and S video there are lots of surplus RCA cables on the market and around the house you did not use. I found an extra set of RCA cables put them together to make the MULTIKEY. This will allow me to hook up any to straight keys or the output of any two electronic keyers or a combination of each. By soldering the cables to each other in parallel any key or keyer output can be used to key the rig. Although I made mine a 2 to 1 MULTIKEY by using more cables you can make a 3 to 1 or more as needed. This comes in handy when switching from a keyer to a straight key. I can program messages in the keyer memory for calling and use the straight key for the contact without having to flip any switches or plug and unplug from the rig. This has been easy to make and really comes in handy on the rig.

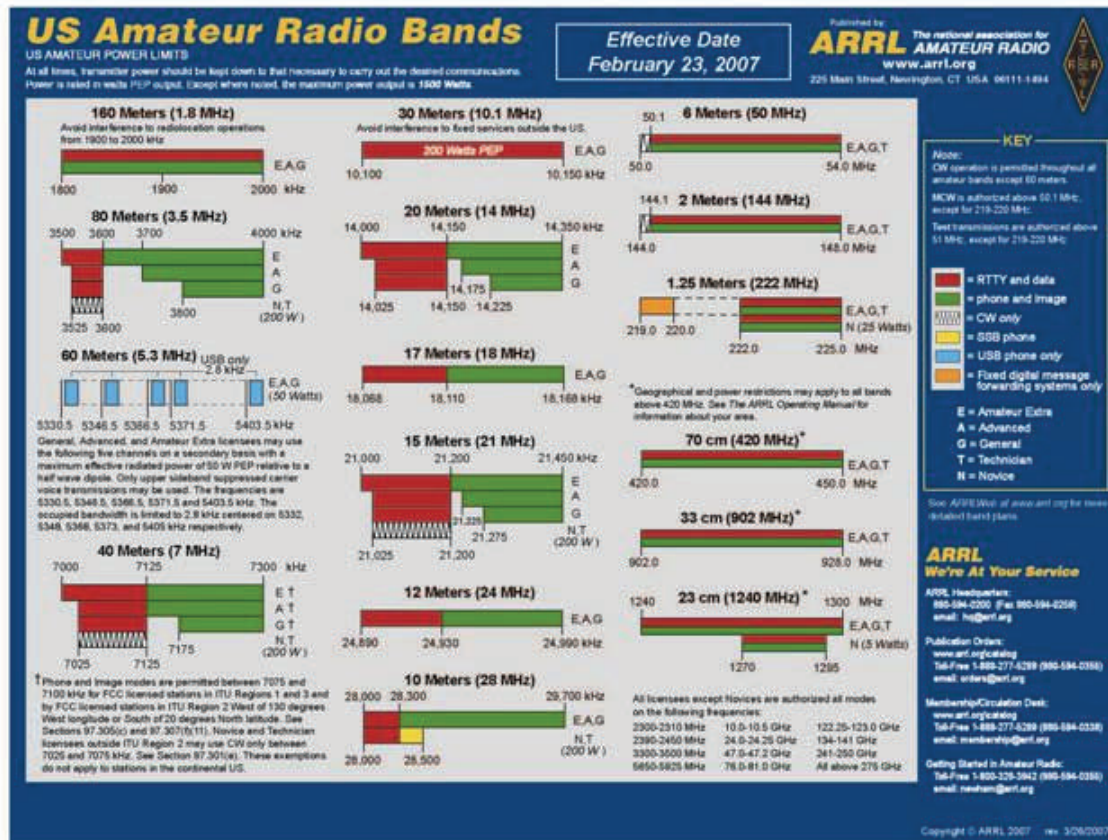
