SAMS RECOMMENDED PACKING LIST

Carry-on items should include items for your first day in case your checked baggage is lost.

Airlines allow checked luggage for a price! If you do check luggage use the space wisely. If you have room, add items to leave behind that will be dispersed by the local church. Examples are clothing, small toys, books, and Bibles in the local language. Ask your missionary if they need or would like anything from the United States.



Your missionary will provide a list of the most needed items for your ministry with them. You may be asked to bring certain tools or equipment with you depending on the nature of your mission.

The list below is a resource for you to use as you make up your own list. You won't need everything on this list, so delete what you won't need and add what you do need. Copy that list and send it to your team members.

Don't take anything you can't afford to lose. Jewelry is a good example.

Note: Electrical appliances such as hair dryers, razors, or irons may need transformers and adapter that differ from the U.S. depending on the host country. Consider doing without, if possible.

RX to control diarrhea
Aspirin
Suntan lotion
Sunscreen lotion
Sunglasses
Sunglasses Any RX you require on a regular basis in its original container
Extra pair of glasses (in case the first pair breaks)
Clothing
Short shorts, short skirts, and midriff tops are definitely not appropriate apparel.
Check with your missionary about the appropriateness of shorts for men.
Work clothes (jeans and t-shirts are appropriate for construction)
Nice, casual clothes for evangelism ministries
1 pair of comfortable walking shoes
Work boots if your team is working in construction
Underwear, one change per day
Sweater or light jacket
Small quantity of laundry detergent
Swimsuit (optional)
Sun hat
Light raincoat, folding umbrella or poncho
Note: Your missionary will give you weather expectations.
Work Day Articles
Purell hand sanitizer or travel towellettes
Water bottle
Daily spending money, if needed
Small sunscreen
Copy of passport (or appropriate ID suggested by missionary or host)
Tissues (may be needed as toilet paper in some places
Bug repellent
Note: Your team should have a basic first aid kit with them. You might consider leaving it behind

Carrying Liquids

Remind them of the requirements for packing liquid in their carry-on. Only 3.4-ounce bottles of liquid are permitted in carry-on bags. Those bottles should be clearly visible in a 1-quart-sized, clear, plastic, zip-top bag that has been placed on top of their clothing.

If necessary medications or other liquids exceed the 3.4-ounce limit, they must be declared and inspected.
