I believe that parent-teacher relationships are necessary to ensure that students reach their full potential so I encourage you to contact me if you have any questions or concerns at any time.





Moving Towards Conceptual Understanding

As you may already know, the elementary school is using the Primary Years Program (PYP) as the framework of our curriculum. The aim of the PYP is to create a trans disciplinary curriculum that is engaging, relevant, challenging and significant for the learners. One of the aims of the PYP is to ensure that students experience coherence in their learning, regardless of which teacher has responsibility for them at any particular point in time.

In the PYP the pronoun "we" is used in each question, rather than referring directly to the students, for reasons that reflect the PYP belief about a school being a community of learners. While recognizing that a school's primary responsibility is for student learning, a school is encouraged to see itself as a community where everyone is a learner, where teachers and parents must continually learn about the needs and capabilities of each student, the content with which they are engaged, and about our personal responsibilities in honing enthusiasm for learning.

Other Important Information

In order to make the school year start smoothly, please take note of the following important points below:

- 1. School begins at 7:30am. Please have your child here at school between 7:15-7:30 to avoid being tardy. The students must wait quietly outside the classroom or at the lobby (for preschool).
- 2. Please label uniforms with your child's name. An extra set of uniforms and underwear in your child's bag will be appreciated.
- 3. We can communicate with each other through the Assignment notebook and Communication Folder. Please bring it to school everyday.
- 4. At 9:00am everyday, your child will be given 5 minutes to eat brain food (nuts, raisins, dried fruits, fresh fruits) to help energize and sustain him/her until recess. For Kinder, Grade 1 and Grade 2, aside from recess snacks, please make sure that your child brings packed lunch. You may also let your child sign for canteen privileges by accomplishing a form from the school's concessionaires. Should you let your child bring money, please make sure that all lunch money is sent in an envelope or wallet with your child's name. You can also pay for lunch in advance. Yayas are not allowed to stay with your child during snack or lunch time. Teachers will be there to assist your child.
- 5. If your child needs to take medication during school hours, please leave the medicine with the nurse who will ensure that your child has taken the correct dosage.
- 6. Toys and other electronic gadgets are not allowed in class.
- 7. If you would like your child to celebrate his/her birthday with their friends in school, please let us know ahead of time. You can send a cake to share with the group or individual cupcakes during snack time.
