Dear OTA Volunteers, Supporters and Friends,

We reached a significant milestone on July 1st as we celebrated our five-year anniversary as Operation Troop Appreciation.

Monica Orluk and I met on the Fourth of July, 2004, just three days after OTA became operational, and since then we've welcomed hundreds of volunteers and friends into the OTA family.

We've come so far since those early days when we first provided Under Armour® shirts and socks for the 420 soldiers of the 1-201st Field Artillery of the West Virginia National Guard.

Since then, more than **52,000 troops** in over 800 deployed units throughout Iraq, Afghanistan, Kuwait, Qatar, the Horn of Africa, and Kosovo have received random acts of kindness and "wish list" gifts from OTA – ranging from mine detectors, weight-lifting equipment, ballistics eye protective glasses, phone cards, Christmas trees, even a swimming pool, to simple pleasures from home like favorite snacks, blankets, personal care items and DVDs.

We've been honored on two separate occasions by **President George W. Bush**, met notable figures such as **Dick Cheney, Joint Chief of Staff Peter Pace**, and **General David Petraeus** (Commander of the coalition forces in Iraq).

I married the love of my life, **Captain Charles Querriera**, whom I met shortly after OTA provided "wish list" items of children's clothing and shoes to him for his soldiers to give out to the local Iragi children. We married last June.

With the dedication of our talented and passionate volunteers, we've conducted four annual golf outings, three annual Veteran's Day 5K races, bike runs, concerts and dozens of collection drives and fundraisers, while ensuring **98.5 cents of every dollar we spend** goes directly to our troop programs.





ANIMAL FRIENDS AND OTA JOIN FORCES!



Sixty-six years ago, at the height of World War II, a small group of Pittsburgh citizens came together in an effort to find homes for soldiers' pets when they left to serve in the war.

Today, Animal Friends runs a no-kill shelter in Pittsburgh's North Side to find forever homes for misplaced pets all over the Pittsburgh area. And they've continued their original wartime tradition by joining OTA in helping deployed K-9 units serving in Iraq and Afghanistan.

Our first joint project with Animal Friends was to provide food, toys and treats for CSM Bagger, a K-9 search and rescue dog who was injured in the line of duty in Iraq. Since that time, OTA and Animal Friends have worked hard to support our troops and the K-9 animals that help them with two very special events.

"Mutt Strut"

The Animal Friends Mutt Strut event took place Memorial Day weekend on the North Shore of Pittsburgh (pictured right). This annual event began with the 316th Expeditionary Sustainment Command, Army Reserves Honor Guard, followed by a one-mile pet walk along the river.

Attending canines provided paw prints for Thank You posters which OTA shipped to deployed soldiers overseas. It was a great way to honor our soldiers and bring attention to the many dogs Animal Friends has for adoption.



"Liberation Day"

The Fourth of July weekend is one of the busiest for Animal Friends. Many pets get lost or spooked from the fireworks and run away or escape through open windows and doors during busy picnics.

On July 8th, Animal Friends took in 20 dogs from area dog control facilities that were scheduled for euthanasia. Many of these dogs are lost and families have the opportunity to reconnect with their pets. Those who remain unclaimed can be adopted by new families and get the love and care they deserve. When the dogs arrive at the shelter they are given new names and OTA helped to provide some very special names for these deserving animals.

All dogs were names in honor of a fallen Pennsylvania hero. Monica Orluk, OTA Vice President, named the first dog "Mac," a Beagle named in honor of Lieutenant Colonel Michael McLaughlin, a PA National Guardsman, who was killed in the line of duty while serving in Iraq in 2005.

All 20 dogs were named after soldiers and Marines who fought and gave the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom. A fitting way to celebrate the freedom and second chance these dogs are now getting from Animal Friends. He now needs help from our service members and other users in contacting your Congressmen to break the logjam he is facing, providing testimonials of your own experience with this product.

Representative Hoyer is the Majority Leader of the House, and his congressional district in Maryland is home to Militec, Inc.
