NEW SCHOOL YEAR PAPERWORK

We are doing our best to cut back on the yearly paperwork. Much of the information can be found online. Please fill out and return the appropriate forms as soon as possible.

PLEASE LOG ONTO GENESIS PARENT ACCESS TO UPDATE YOUR HOME CONTACT, EMERGENCY and PARENT PICK-UP INFORMATION

All of your contact information, including emergency contacts, should be entered into Genesis. Please update all your children's doctor/dentist information as well. If you have a change of address, phone number or contact information, you can update your account online. Make sure to include your current cell phone carrier, so that emergency text messaging can be sent out to you. Your username will be your current email address.

EMERGENCY ALERT SYSTEM

Keeping parents informed and involved helps to assure student safety. Honeywell instant alert is internet based, allowing each family to maintain a secure, password protected on-line profile. **Please log on to Genesis** – go to contacts and set up or update your family profile, so that we may contact you via email, text message or by cell or home phone to inform you of school closings and important information sent from school.

STUDENT LUNCH PROGRAM

The cost for student lunches is **\$2.70** and the cost of milk is .55 cents. **On the school website**, you will find the September menu and a "Student Lunch Account" form. You may send cash or checks for the amount you would like to keep in your child's account. As your child makes purchases, he/she will enter their individual "PIN" number. You will receive a statement of all charges at the end of each month from Nutri-Serve. **Please put all monies in a sealed envelope marked with your** child's name, homeroom and amount enclosed. Checks should be made payable to "Chesterfield Board of Education." Please send exact amount, as monies are directly deposited. Money will be collected in classrooms and forwarded to the cafeteria each day. If you have a specific concern, please include a note to the attention of the cafeteria manager – Angela Giovacchini.

◆ <u>STUDENT SCHOOL INSURANCE</u>

The Chesterfield Board of Education has purchased student accident insurance for all students attending Chesterfield School. The insurance plan covers the student during school hours and during school sponsored and supervised activities. This coverage begins after all family insurance has been used and/or proof is presented that the family has no other medical coverage.

◆ FREE AND REDUCED LUNCHES

Please check off the appropriate box, sign and send the form back to school **only if you are applying for benefits**. Please note: Only one form per household should be returned to the school. If you have children attending Northern Burlington as well, separate applications must be submitted to each school. By law, the school has ten working days to reply to your request.

• <u>INTEGRATED PEST MANAGEMENT/FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS &</u> <u>PRIVACY ACT (POSTED ON SCHOOL WEBSITE)</u>

New Jersey law requires that parents be updated on the Integrated Pest Management plan annually. **The plan is posted on the school website under BOE policies & plans**. • AFFIRMATIVE ACTION

The Chesterfield Township School District is an Affirmative Action/Equal Educational School District and Employer. If any parent/guardian, student, or other person feels that he or she or any other person is being or has been discriminated against because of race, color, creed, religion, sex, ancestry, national origin, socioeconomic status or handicap, such discrimination should be reported immediately to the following school district officer: Dr. Gino Sivieri.

<u>ABSENCES</u>

If your child is going to be absent from school due to illness, you must call the school office to report that your child will not be present in school. Please call the main office at 298-6900 by 8:45 a.m. and leave a message after the "To report a student absence prompt". In order for the absence to be excused, you must also send a note into school the day of his/her return, stating that your child was ill. If a child is absent for 5 days or more consecutive days, you must supply a doctor's note in order for the absences to be excused. Religious observances, bereavement days

and required court appearances will also be excused with a note. Vacation days are unexcused absences.

• BACKPACKS

Because of space limitations on our buses, it is necessary to restrict backpack size to a maximum of 15" wide by 18" long (approximately) and **only the non-wheeled variety are permitted on the bus.** Teachers have indicated that this style sufficiently meets their standards regarding the materials students transport between home and school.

<u>BEFORE & AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAM</u>

• **<u>BIRTHDAY PARTIES</u>**

Following up on suggestions made by our school Wellness Council, food will not be served in school for children's birthday celebrations. Teachers will develop grade level guidelines for birthday celebration activities.

If you are planning a party at home, please only send invitations in to school if you will be inviting everyone (or just the same gender) in the class. If you are sending only to a few classmates, please distribute them by mail. Thanks for your cooperation!

• <u>CELL PHONES & ELECTRONIC DEVICES</u>

Cell phones have become a part of our daily routine. However, the use of cell phones in school by students is prohibited, unless the use is approved by a teacher or administrator. If a child is carrying a cell phone in his/her backpack for emergency use, it must not be displayed while in school or on the bus. If a student is found using or playing with a cell phone during school, it will be confiscated and a parent/guardian must come into the school office to retrieve it. All electronic devices, IPods, Gameboy, etc., **should be enjoyed at home**. Thanks for understanding.

• <u>CHILD FIND</u>

If you have concerns about your preschool child's (ages 3-5 years) language, social or learning development, please call our Child Study Team office at 609-298-3027. Our Supervisor of Special Services, Dr. Gino Sivieri; Supervisor of Curriculum, Mrs. Jeanine May-Sivieri, School Social Worker, Mrs. Cindy McNally or Speech Pathologist, Ms Marian Rock will be happy to speak to you about your concerns and provide information about the Child Study Team evaluation process and possible services that may be provided for pre-school students.

If you have concerns about your infant or preschool child's development (birth - 3 years) services may be available through New Jersey's Early Intervention System. Please call **PROJECT CHILD FIND** at 1-800-322-8174 or Burlington County Early Intervention at 609-267-1950.

EARLY PICKUP

If you are picking your child before early, please send a note into the teacher with all the details – time of pickup, who will be picking up and the reason for early dismissal. If your child is picked up before 3:00 p.m., they will be charged as a tardy for on their attendance record. Regular dismissal begins at 3:10 pm.

• **KINDERGARTEN ROUNDUP**

If you have a child **who will be five years old on or before October 1, 2016**, you should register on-line beginning in January on the school website under kindergarten registration at <u>www.Chesterfieldschool.com</u>. Kindergarten screenings are held in the spring for all our new enrollments and parents will be notified by mail at that time.

• LOST AND FOUND

Items found without any identification will be placed on the "Lost and Found" table located in the cafeteria. Please check this table if your child is missing a lunchbox, coat, book-bag or other items.

OPEN DOOR POLICY

The Chesterfield Township School faculty, staff and administration believe that a child's parents and local community are an important and integral part of the total school program. The Superintendent and all other personnel will welcome any inquiries, questions or suggestions from any interested member of the community.

• <u>VISITORS</u>

In our continuing efforts to ensure the safety of our students, every visitor must sign in and obtain a visitor's pass upon arrival. For security reasons, you should never go directly to the classroom without being announced.
