Wednesday, July 20 - Neurology Through the Ages

The various causes of dementia will be presented as will the new theories of Alzheimer's disease and Parkinson's disease.

Thursday, July 21 - Interpretation of Lab Tests

The lipid profile will be discussed as will liver function tests and clinical correlations. Barb will also correlate various drugs with their effects on lab tests, including chemotherapy, antibiotics, statins, and other lipid-lowering agents.
