Message from the President, Nancy Lutz:

Funny how the mind works. I was reviewing the responses to our membership drive and I realized how many senior citizens have been long-time residents of Washington Square and decided to focus my message on a few of them. In order to protect their privacy I will refer to them by street only.

When have a couple on Baker who moved from Des Moines, Iowa to Santa Ana in 1950. The husband was with the Army Air Corp unit conveniently stationed at the facility which is now the parking lot for Eddie West Stadium. They had several children so they needed a large house. They liked the neighborhood and were close to a Lutheran church. The wife briefly wrote an article entitled "Hello Santa Ana" under the pen name of Nancy Newcomer in a small newspaper known as The Globe started by two gentlemen, one of whom was Sky Dunlap, an instructor at Santa Ana College. They no longer drive, but a caring neighbor and fellow churchmember gives them a ride on Sundays. They are both proud and pleased with what is going on in the neighborhood.

We have a resident who came to Santa Ana in 1952 and purchased their home on Westwood in October 1959. They needed a bigger house at the time and fell in love with their Westwood home. The husband worked in the construction industry and it was not uncommon for him to drive to Los Angeles or Camp Pendleton on a daily basis to a job site. There were no freeways then, so his day would sometimes begin at 4:00 a.m. and end late in the evening. In spite of this, they were never interested in leaving their family and friends in Santa Ana.

Next we have acouple on Baker who moved into their larger home in 1959. The husband taught at Wilson Elementary School for 38 years. They only had one car which the wife used unless her husband had after-work meetings. All of their children graduated from Wilson, Willard and Santa Ana High. When their daughter was about four years old she was riding her tricycle south on Baker toward Civic Center, which was not a cul-de-sac at the time. Some suspicious men drove by eyeing the little girl and when their neighbor saw what was happening, went out to protect her. This couple still appreciate their good, caring neighbors.

Lastly and again on Westwood, we have a neighbor who, with her husband, moved from a Santa Ana home on Cubbon Street where they owned and operated a country store selling paper Americana and collectibles in the front, and they lived behind the store. When the store was closed they went to Italy for awhile. Upon their return they moved to their home on Westwood in 1989 partly because the street reminded them of the trees around their former home in Sacramento. Also, it has a small building in the rear where they could store the inventory from the store. The husband worked for many years as the manager of Bidwells, a fine men's store on I ido Isle.

There are many, many more seniors living in the neighborhood who have interesting life stories and backgrounds. I appreciate their contribution and am glad they have remained in Washington Square. If you have an interesting story to tell about yourself or living in Washington Square please let me know.

Usually there are a few spots of activity but you will see that compared to some other neighborhoods in Santa Ana, we have quite a low level of criminal activity. It probably helps that we are located adjacent to the main police department and have watchful neighbors.

In addition he is an expert on lawns and lawncare. He knows everything (honest) and you can call him anytime for some reliably on-the-mark advice.



DID YOU KNOW?

- It is illegal to dispose of hazardous waste in personal or public trash cans and it is punishable by a \$25,000 fine. This includes motor oil, housepaint and other toxic substances.
- **Trash containers** are not to be put out on Sunday before 4:00 PM and must be taken in by 12:00 midnight Monday evening. Trash containers must be stored so they are not visible from the street.
- **Garage/Yard Sales** are only allowed on the first weekend of March, June, September, and December, Saturday and Sunday only. Items must not be put out before 7:00 AM and taken in by 4:00 PM. No new merchandise is allowed to be sold.
- **Cars** are never to be parked on the lawn. Inoperable vehicles are not allowed on the street or in the driveways and cars can not remain in the street for more than 72 hours without being moved. Inoperable vehicles are vehicles that are either damaged, flat tires, and do not run.
- Front yard fences require a building permit and can not be over 30" high. The permits are free. Contact the building department 667-2700 for more information. Maintain your wood fences by keeping them painted and in good repair.
- Store Shopping Carts are a blight when left on the street after they are stolen from stores. The solution? If this applies to you, please use your own folding shopping cart (pictured at left) instead of stealing them from stores to transport your purchases. It is expensive for the city to pick them up (\$75 each time) and you can buy your own for around \$10-25 at nearby stores. It's an investment in good neighbor relations.
