THE CHALLENGE

The focus for Place Challenge 2015 is Town Centre Living. Changing economic circumstances, competition and patterns of service provision are challenging the role of town centres as sustainable places.

Rethinking town centres as places to live is one possible future. But, how do we-working collaboratively - create town centres as living places that re-use existing spaces to deliver housing, opportunity and services in the right place, for the most impact?

The aim of the event is to bring together key people and organisations around the town centre living agenda of the Scottish Government's Town Centre Action plan, and the Joint Housing Delivery Plan for Scotland to explore creative approaches to reimagine, redesign and reuse town centres as places for living.

We believe that getting the right people in the room, with the right challenge and support, will help make an important difference to our town centres.

Architecture and Design Scotland and partners invite you to join us in Arbroath on 28-29 October to take on this important Place Challenge.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

The event is aimed at professionals who can have an impact on the shape of our town centres. We would like to see attendance from public, private or community sectors in the following areas: housing, economic development, regeneration, housebuilding, community planning, public services and agencies as well as planning, urban design and architecture.

FORMAT

Using Arbroath as a 'learning place' we will offer a two day, collaborative learning experience focusing on how to deliver town centre living through a programme of keynote presentations, site visits, workshops, collaborative design exercises and engagement with live projects. Study sites and scenarios will be carefully selected to typify issues affecting town centres across Scotland.

BENEFITS

The Place Challenge is a practical, multidisciplinary learning event, offering you the opportunity to:

- Share practice with your peers from across Scotland (what's working, what are the barriers?)
- Hear from contributors with potential solutions to your challenges on the ground
- Engage with policymakers, funders and agencies who can support you to influence change
- Develop approaches and networks to help you deliver change in your place

PROGRAMME

The full programme will follow later in Summer 2015. You can expect it to focus on the following:

- Examining shared benefits of town centre living by re-imagining existing town centre assets to consider what works well, what needs to be improved and what should be prioritised
- Appraising opportunities for town centre living and supporting services, in the wider context of the system of surrounding towns, strategic landscape and green infrastructure assets
- Exploring potential for town centre living to support health and wellbeing outcomes as part of locality planning within the community planning, health and social care integration agendas
- Testing strategies for local area collaboration on investment, development and risk management for housing and associated town centre living uses
- Gaining insights into how to address issues around the viability of re-thinking empty buildings, stalled spaces and underused places for homes and other uses, to re-vitalise our town centres as places to live.
