STOP HUNGER NOW

The schedule for the day is as follows:

8:30 - 9:30	ASLC Worship (as regularly scheduled)
9:45 - 10:45	ASLC Education Hour (as regularly scheduled)
11:00-11:45	ASLC abbreviated worship service
11:30 - 1:00	Five "heavy-lifter" volunteers unload supplies at Grace Lutheran Church to set up their Fellowship Hall for the 1:00 event
11:50 - 12:40	Lunch for packaging volunteers in ASLC Fellowship Hall
12:45 - 12:55	Travel to Grace Lutheran Church for the meal-packaging
1:00 - *3:00	50+ packaging volunteers will assemble 10,000 meals, estimated to take 2 hours.
*2:45 - *4:15	A minimum of five volunteer "heavy lifters" will break down Fellowship Hall and reload the packaged meals on the truck provided by Stop Hunger Now for return to their warehouse

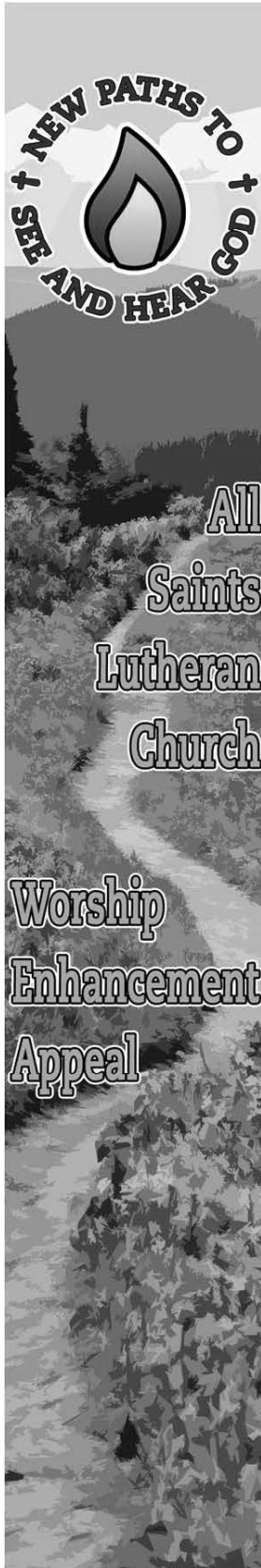
