## 1. Overview of the Role

- 1.1 The National Eating Disorders Collaboration (NEDC) is a national collaboration of organisations and individuals with an interest, expertise and experience in the promotion, prevention, early intervention, treatment and management of eating disorders. The primary purpose of the NEDC project is to bring together Eating Disorder stakeholders with experts in mental health, public health, health promotion, education, research and media as well practitioners and those with a lived experience of eating disorders to develop and maintain a nationally consistent approach to the prevention and management of Eating Disorders.
- 1.2 The position of Project Officer is responsible for undertaking projects to develop resources and actively encourage the uptake of information and knowledge developed by the NEDC by its stakeholders. This will include the development of written reports which encourage research in practice. The role works closely with the Project Manager and other NEDC team members and will have relationships with key members and stakeholders in the collaboration. The position may require some travel and after hours work.
- **1.3** The position of Project Officer is a temporary, full-time position up to end of June 2014. Further extensions of the position may be negotiated in the future, subject to funding and other project requirements.

# 2. Relationships

- **2.1** The position of Project Officer reports to the NEDC Project Manager.
- 2.2 In addition, the Project Officer will work with and have relationships with:
  - a. NEDC National Director and CEO Butterfly Foundation
  - d. Other NEDC and Butterfly Foundation staff
  - e. NEDC Steering Committee members
  - f. NEDC members, stakeholders and participants in NEDC activities
  - g. Clinicians, related professionals and other organisations in eating disorders and related sectors
  - h. Consultants and external contractors.

# 3. Role Objectives/Responsibilities

- **3.1** Undertake projects which link research to practice and engage professionals in implementing evidence based practice.
- **3.2** Prepare written resources for publication on the NEDC website and in hard copy.
- **3.3** Present information and resources to groups of professionals and community members in face to face and web-based forums.
- **3.4** Contribute to needs analysis of particular stakeholder groups.
- 3.5 Contribute to the ongoing evaluation and quality improvement processes within the NEDC.
- **3.6** Undertake other activities as required in conjunction with other members of the NEDC team.

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# 4. Other Requirements

- 4.1 As an employee, be aware of the need to be responsible for the general care and well being of people you deal with during your employment activities.

- Understanding of the principles of evidence-based practice and their application in a health context
- Capacity to develop formal and informal relationships in order to engage with stakeholders and develop a culture of constructive collaboration.

- Experience and/or qualifications in adult education and workplace training and assessment.
- Demonstrated experience working in a mental health setting or an area relevant to our key stakeholders (e.g. education, youth, general medical practice, allied health).

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
