Add these to your 2009 calendar:

### At least once a year

- ✓ change the batteries in your smoke detectors replace smoke detector and fire extinguisher as needed
- ✓ submit your record of skill development\* to your resources social worker for your annual review
- ✓ submit *Health Care Passport* and *Cultural Log Book* (only aboriginal children in care) to child's social worker for child's Plan of Care
- ✓ give child's social worker a recent photo for their file
- ✓ renew your BCFFPA or AFPABC membership (BC Federation of Foster Parent Associations/ Aboriginal Foster Parents Association of BC) and be part of the collective voice of Foster Parents in BC
- ✓ review Schedule A of your contract, and Standards for Foster Homes\*, to ensure you
  are meeting your obligations

### At least every 3 months

- √ invite a social worker to your home
- √ has your child grown? Get car seats/booster seats checked
- ✓ update your emergency kit

### **Every month**

- ✓ submit a *monthly report*\* for each child in care
- ✓ submit billing forms if you have provided respite/relief
- ✓ submit mileage form\* if you are pre-approved for extra mileage
- ✓ check your smoke detectors and fire extinguishers. Hold a fire drill
- ✓ update your skill development record\*
- ✓ schedule respite for next month
- ✓ add to child's life book
- ✓ return resources to Foster Parent Library



### **Daily**

- ✓ record in each child's daily log book\*. Also record in health care passport/cultural log book/ medications record\* if there is info to include
- ✓ celebrate all you give to the children of our community through fostering



Non Violent Crisis Intervention is a system for defusing escalating behavior and safely managing physically aggressive behavior. This training provides an understanding of effective communication during aggressive moments, along with the core philosophy of maintaining care, welfare, safety and security. It is recommended training for <u>all</u> Foster Parents, whether they have children who are physically aggressive or not.

### from the Resources Team:

Happy New Year! I hope you had a great holiday season and everyone is well fed, well loved and ready for new adventures!

We are setting new goals for this year and I want to let you know what we'll be focusing on in the next year and ongoing.

Monthly reports: I am asking all foster families to submit monthly updates to their child's social worker and I will be following up with your Resource Worker to ensure that you are getting the help you need to get started. There are several good examples of outlines on the OFPA website or your child's social worker or resource social worker would be happy to give you a printed copy for you to use. Monthly reports are the best way to ensure that the guardianship worker has the information they need to work with you to plan for the child and they provide a way for you to track progress, changes and needs. I am often told by foster parents that the Social Worker doesn't listen to them or take their input into consideration and these reports are a way to ensure that your professional parenting is being reported in your words on a regular basis.

Lifebooks for Children in Care: All Children in Care need a LifeBook to honour their life transitions and experiences. We will be working with the adoption social worker and the adoption support worker from NOYFSS to provide some training and support in this process. There are many examples and some foster parents have lots of experience so we hope to develop some supports to you in this. The books are an important tool in helping the children we care for transition and move along in their life events.

Also in the news and updates department: Foster parents are able to sign and consent to immunizations for children in care via court order. Please check with your child's social worker if the child is in care through an agreement as the situation may be different and the parent may consent.
