Non Violent Crisis Intervention – Core Training (no restraint): 9 AM – 12:30 PM, Oct. 28 & 30 in Salmon Arm

<u>Non Violent Crisis Intervention – Refresher</u>: 9 AM – 2:30 PM, October 29. For Foster Parents whose certification has not expired.

Non Violent Crisis Intervention is a system for defusing escalating behavior and safely managing physically aggressive behavior. This training provides an understanding of effective communication during aggressive moments, along with the core philosophy of maintaining care, welfare, safety and security. It is recommended training for <u>all</u> Foster Parents, whether they have children who are physically aggressive or not.

On completion you will receive certification from the Crisis Prevention Institute No charge, but you MUST pre-register with Noelle. Seating is limited
