Term Fees - Tim Walsh, Business Manager - School Fees for Term 1 are payable by Friday 10 February unless an alternative arrangement is in place. All fee payment arrangements must be renewed annually. Please contact the Business Manager or Accounts Office to discuss a payment arrangement for 2012. The Accounts Office phone numbers are: 54211247 or 54211239.

Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA 2012) - Mrs Melinda Plumb - The EMA is provided to assist eligible families with the costs associated with the education of their children. To be eligible for receipt of the EMA you must:

- Be either a parent or guardian of a primary or secondary school student up to the age of sixteen; and
- Be an eligible beneficiary of a Centrelink pension, allowance or benefit within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004 or be a Veterans Affairs (TPI) pensioner or be a foster parent.

The eligibility criteria must be met as at the first day of Term 1 (1 February 2012) and Term 3 (18 July 2012). The EMA application must be submitted to the school by 29 February 2012 for the first instalment and 3 August 2012 for the second instalment.

The EMA provides an annual amount of \$470.00 for secondary students and is paid in two instalments. This amount is split evenly between the parents/guardians and the school. Students turning 16 years in 2012 will be paid on a pro rata basis.

If you have any gueries regarding EMA or to get an application form please contact me in the Accounts Office.

2012 School Bus / Conveyance arrangements - Mr Tim Walsh, Business Manager - As per previous advice, some new students are not eligible for the Conveyance Allowance in 2012, particularly those from the Gisborne/Macedon area. The guidelines covering conveyance are set by the Victorian State Government and not the College. Recent changes are the result of several factors, including Salesian College (which is closer to where some students live) having vacancies, and also a tightening of the administration of Conveyance Allowance guidelines, even though the guidelines themselves have not changed. New students whose closest Catholic school is Sacred Heart College, are not affected and are eligible for Conveyance Allowance. Similarly, students in higher Year Levels who have been deemed eligible in prior years, will still receive the Conveyance Allowance.

We understand that those families needing to pay for transport have an additional financial burden. Whilst this fee is directly payable to the bus company, and therefore beyond our scope for financial arrangements, the College remains open to any family in financial hardship for whatever reason. We ask that families contact Mrs Melinda Plumb in our Accounts Office with particular bus gueries, or the College Business Manager, Mr Tim Walsh for general matters involving financial circumstances. Digital Technologies - Ms Peita Rocard - Year 9 Pilot iPad Program - All students have now been issued with their college iPad and are carrying them around in a wide variety of different covers. The students have been very proactive in setting up their iPads at home and are now starting to use them in several classes. Students from Years 9 and 11 were very responsive to the special session we ran on Monday morning. In collaboration with Annie Rowland, Youth Development Officer at the Macedon Ranges Shire Council, the students were encouraged to consider some "ethical dilemnas" which may arise in the use of new technology and online activities. Student representatives in our panel session were Alannah Preston of Year 9 and Hayden Peel from Year 11, they joined teacher representatives Mr Dave DeGrandi, Mrs Merilyn Hoysted, and Mr Sacha Chambers. We will be running a further information session for Year 9s this Friday to show them how to set up email and printing access.



Year 11 Laptops - Parents of students who have been issued with a new laptop for 2012 must ensure that a zip case is provided to protect the laptop. Some additional cases have been ordered by the College and will be sold to students if they do not have one of their own by Monday 13th February.

House Swimming Carnival Friday 17 February Mr Adam Johnstone, Sports Coordinator



We are looking forward to our annual House Swimming Carnival at the Sunbury Aquatic Centre. Such events at the College provide wonderful opportunities for your child to learn more about themselves. Whether they are talented swimmers or

not is not important but their willingness to 'have a go' and get involved in some way is. There are a variety of formal and novelty swimming events on the program and participation earns points. Each child is a House and the House Captains have been enthusiastic about promoting a spirit of unity and 'all for one and one for all'. Students will travel to the pool via buses (all per the details on the letter to be sent home by Mr Reed). On arrival at the pool students are requested to immediately report to their Homeroom Teacher in order to have their name marked off the roll. We

ask for your support in reminding your child of this procedure. If they fail to complete this process they will be marked as absent and College Office staff will make phone calls home to parents, perhaps unnecessarily.

We are optimistic that the sun will be shining and the pool glistening, therefore, students are strongly encouraged to take five steps to protect themselves against sun damage. They are as follows:



Full PE uniform is to be worn BUT this year, students can purchase a **House Polo from the Uniform Shop for \$20**. Leaders and staff have been wearing these around the school to promote them, and they look great, so it would be wonderful to see as many students in them as possible. Year 12 students are invited to don 'fancy dress' in their House colours once they arrive at the pool but must not wear it in the pool. At the request of Pool Management, the use of zinc is to be limited and applied to the face only. The Justice and Service Group will provide a Sausage Sizzle to raise funds for charity. In terms of swimming costumes, students must wear modest and practical swim wear.
