

Prayer and Talking With God

Message from Rabbi Mike Lotker

You may find it hard to believe, but I attended the first High Holy Days of my life less than 30 years ago (I grew up in a very *Yiddishkeit* or culturally Jewish but completely non-observant home). I remember thinking then as the

congregation dutifully read the liturgy, "What kind of a God would appreciate praise read unquestioningly from a book?" It was as though I might have lined up my children and written a bunch



One Hebrew word for prayer is *l'hitpalel*, meaning to examine one's self. I believe that prayer is more important for <u>us</u> than it is for <u>God</u>. I'm pretty sure that God doesn't need our prayers but I am sure that we need to be the kind of people that turn to God in prayer, that believe that there is more to the world than what can be created by our own two hands. We need to have someone to whom we can ask comfort and to whom we can give thanks. We need to pray. We need to pray at home as well as in the synagogue.

I invite you to try prayer at home in two easy steps. First try simply reciting the Shema ("Shema Yisrael, Adonai Eloheinu, Adonai Echad" "Hear O Israel, Adonai is

our God, Adonai is One") at home when (as it says in the Torah) you rise up and when you lie down. You can and should do this with your children. If you want more once you master this, chant the *v'ah-haf-ta* (ask any Bar/Bat Mitzvah child

for help). If you still want more, we have a wonderful daily liturgy at your fingertips in the prayer book.

I also invite you to simply talk to God, routinely, at least once a day. Find a quiet time when you will not be interrupted. Simply start talking to God

- out loud. It may seem very strange and awkward at first. You may be inundated with doubts about your sanity and whether you can really talk to God when you are not sure that you truly believe in God. Gently push all these thoughts aside. Don't let your doubts about God interfere with your relationship with the Holy One. Simply pour out your heart. Ask for the big things and the little things. Thank God for all the blessings in your life and ask for the strength to endure the challenges. And (PLEASE NOTE THAT THIS IS REALLY IMPORTANT) don't forget to be still long enough for God to answer you. So many of us pray for things and then just as God is about to respond, we hang up! May God enrich our lives through the

spiritual discipline of daily prayer!

Plan for Celebration

We tend to lead very busy lives. Much of the time we're just trying to make it through each week, and handle the every day things. As we look from summer toward fall, we can already feel ourselves 'gearing up' for what we know is coming, the onslaught

of work after the pause we tend to take in the much needed calm of the summer months. Often we are caught by a sudden realization that it is someone's birthday or anniversary, and we rush out to buy a card or send a gift – the card companies know this too, as evidenced by the category of 'late' birthday cards they offer. We can learn something about planning ahead, planning for celebration from a *midrash*, a story, about Miriam and the women at the shores of the Red Sea:

After the families of Israel crossed the sea, two song leaders led them in song. One was Moses and the other was Miriam. Miriam was Moses' older sister, the one who watched over him when he was just a baby, in the basket floating in the water. Miriam was a prophetess, the one who predicted that Moses would lead Israel out of slavery, out of Egypt.

When the families of Israel had safely crossed the Red Sea in leaving Egypt, Miriam started to sing, and all the women picked up their drums and began to sing and dance with her. The midrash asks an interesting question: Where did the drums come from? The midrash answers its own question by saying, "The women had faith. They believed that God would indeed liberate them from Egypt. They also knew that when God liberated them, they would have to thank and praise God. The women brought the drums as an act of faith. They had already planned that celebration." – Midrash

The women had faith, they brought their drums in anticipation of celebration. Getting through each day is something they worked toward, and with their faith, they knew that God would liberate them from Egypt, and they would want to say thank you to God, acknowledge the miracle.

When we reach milestones, birthdays, anniversaries, the end of a school year, retirement, sometimes simply just to complete the work week, it is indeed a time for celebration, acknowledgment, and to thank God.

The women had faith and gratitude, two traits that we can take on just in one phrase: *Plan to Celebrate!*

the Tesoro Avenue facility to Temple Avenue.


The Library is used as a meeting and conference room throughout the week. We had to empty all those piles of boxes filled with books very quickly. Shlomo and Charlotte Kreitzer and I just shoved the books on every available shelf, even double shelved the books just to clear the floor of the Library of all the boxes.

I am now classifying and cataloging the books under the Dewey system and it is very slow going, making sure that each book is stamped with our identifying Temple Ner Ami stamp and cards are typed and identifying subject labels are put on the spine of each book for easy viewing.

If a book or video was borrowed before our move, please return it to the Book Cart in the Library, so that it can

be classified and catalogued. Thank you.




