## From the Desk of Fr. Tom

### Part III "The Mass as Heaven on Earth"

This weekend, we continue with the final part in a three part series on the "Mass as Heaven on Earth."

As we analyze further we see that the Apocalypse and the Mass divide in half. In the book of Revelation we see emphasis put on the "opening of the scroll" and the "proclamation of the letters to seven churches." The emphasis here is placed on what is proclaimed. One can see here a similarity to the Liturgy of the Word. In the letters to the various churches the word repent is used eight times by Jesus. Cannot this be a kind of "Penitential Rite." One can read in the Didache, a liturgical book from the first century, the following interesting words. "First confess your transgressions, that your sacrifice might be pure." In the book of Revelation we hear the words "Blessed is he who reads aloud the words of the prophecy, and blessed are those who hear." (Rev. 1:3)

The second half of the Book of Revelation commences in Chapter 11. Here we see the "opening of God's Temple in Heaven" and finishes with the "pouring of the seven chalices" and "the marriage supper of the Lamb," a real banquet with Eucharistic overtones. This second half presents for each of us a very compelling image of the second half of the Mass, the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

We find that Revelation is an "unveiling." It is the definition of the Greek word "apokalypsis." The letter to the Hebrews (12:21-24) tells us where we can find heaven, not too distant from the old Jerusalem. All roads that are of a scriptural nature lead to Mount Zion, the city of the King, David. It is there that God would be among His people forever. Zion was the place where the Holy Eucharist was instituted and where the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles that first Pentecost. Having said all this, reflect then on the following. "Today, even though we are thousands of miles from that little hill in Israel, we are there with Jesus in the upper room, and we are there with Jesus in heaven, whenever we go to Mass." (Scott Hahn)

Further, whenever we go to Mass, "we go to Heaven" right here, right now, not when we die. Scott Hahn, a biblical scholar and convert, tells us this is real, it is not "a metaphor", "a mere symbol", "not a parable", "not a figure of speech", it is truly real for us.

Long ago in the fourth century, St. Athanasius wrote, "my beloved brethren, it is no temporal feast that we come to, but an eternal heavenly feast. We do not display it in shadows; we approach it in reality. The Mass for us, is truly the "perfect Sacrifice of the Cross on Calvary." It is presented "once for all" for all eternity. There was one sacrifice that is "perpetual and eternal," never needs to be repeated again. And yet, "the Mass is our participation in that one sacrifice and in the eternal life of the Trinity in heaven, where the Lamb stands eternally 'as if slain'." (Scott Hahn) We need to look at Holy Mass with new eyes of faith. Why? Because "Heaven is here" it is "unveiled" for us, the communion of saints surrounds us as well as the angels and archangels, on the Mount we call Zion. All this is present whenever we go to Mass, we truly go to Heaven on Earth. "For the Mass is the marriage supper of the Lamb." Jesus awaits us in Holy Communion, he says "Behold, I stand at the door and knock." (Revelation 3:20) We were made for the eternal life of God in Heaven. Remember, "the door opens now on the marriage supper of the Lamb, the Lamb of God."
