

Cheese Technology Tour October 1-12, 2014 Spain

Spain conjures up images of flamenco dancers, café-lined plazas, white hillside villages and soaring cathedrals. Beyond these traditional associations, this modern country offers top-notch art museums, inventive cuisine and exciting nightlife. From the Pyrenees to the coast, its landscape and varied cultures are worth exploring. Especially enticing is the national insistence on enjoying everyday pleasures. The Spanish live life to its fullest, whether they are strolling in the park, pausing for a siesta, lingering over lunch or dancing until dawn.

We have put together a wonderful tour! Not only are we visiting the great sites of Spain, but we will learn about the thriving dairy industry and visit some world-famous cheese factories.

Wednesday, October 1: Depart U.S.

Transfer from Madison to Chicago via motorcoach to catch your overnight flight to Seville, Spain aboard Iberia Airlines.

Thursday, October 2: Seville

After arriving in Seville this morning and meeting our guide and driver, we will embark on a city tour. We'll see the Bell Tower of the Giralda and the tiled fountains, pavilions and lush palms in the Maria Luisa Park, renowned for its landscape design. We'll also visit the tomb of Christopher Columbus in the cathedral. The remainder of the afternoon is yours to rest or explore before a welcome dinner this evening.



Friday, October 3: Seville

Today we will visit a local dairy goat farm with 1500 goats near Alcalá de los Gazules – Cádiz, owned by Carlos Ruiz Winters. Next, we will visit a farmstead artisanal cheese plant and their sheep and goat herd, owned by Andres and Jose Luis Holgado. They have invited us to their typical Andalusian farm, where we will also enjoy lunch.



Saturday, October 4: Optional tour to Gibraltar

Take this unforgettable journey in which we combine history, multiculturalism, impressive caves and the funny and famous monkeys of Gibraltar. This morning will start with a panoramic visit which includes "Punta de Europa," the most southern spot in Europe from where we will be able to view Africa. Admire the views of the Spanish and Moroccan coastlines from the top of the Rock. We will visit the amazing caves of San Miguel, followed by the unique opportunity of accompanying the funny and famous monkeys of Gibraltar, a unique breed of monkeys in Old Europe. Then

you will have some free-time on your own, maybe to have some lunch or to explore the bustling pedestrian streets of Gibraltar. Shopping in Gibraltar is known worldwide for its low prices in jewelry, watches, electronic items, spirits, cosmetics and perfumes. If you choose not to travel to Gibraltar, you will have a free day to explore Seville.



Sunday, October 5: Ronda

This morning will start with a visit to a bullfight breeding farm. The farm owner is a matador and will show us the life of a bullfight before going to the arena: the breeding, selection testing which includes a test at the bullfight arena. This afternoon we will visit Ronda and start our tour strolling through the 19th century gardens in Alameda del Tajo, from where the views are simply breathtaking. See the famous Plaza de Toros de Ronda, unique in the world and recognized as one of the oldest and most monumental bullrings made of stone. You will discover the real symbol of the city, the New Bridge, which connects Ronda's old and new districts, from where you can enjoy the great view of the Tajo de Ronda. The tour also includes the Old Bridge, Felipe V Gate Bridge and San Miguel, landscapes of extraordinary beauty, and the Church of Santa Maria, built on the old mosque and located in the historic center of the city. In Santa Maria, admire the Mudejar Tower and the flirtatious "Casita de la Toree," a blend of Christian Arab, late Gothic and Renaissance characteristics, the most representative building of religious architecture in Ronda.

Monday, October 6: Seville, Caceres, Salamanca

Today, we head north on our way to Salamanca. As a break in today's journey, we will make a lunch hour stop in Caceres and enjoy this beautiful place, one of the 13 cities named a World Heritage site by UNESCO in Spain. Caceres will transport you to another era. After a short guided visit, we will continue on to Salamanca.

Tuesday, October 7: Salamanca

A full day in and around the area of Salamanca. After a morning technical visit the remainder of the day is yours to explore.

Wednesday, October 8: Valladolid

After breakfast this morning, we will travel sixty miles to the city of Valladolid. Originally settled by the Celtics, Valladolid hosts one of the oldest universities in the world and has become an economic center for Spain's growing high-tech industry. This afternoon we will have a technical visit just outside of the city before returning for free time to explore.

Thursday, October 9: Valladolid

After breakfast, we will have an opportunity for a few more technical visits in the area before returning this afternoon for a city tour and free time.

Friday, October 10: Madrid

Today we head towards the capital of Spain, Madrid – the 3rd largest city in Europe. Upon arrival, we will enjoy a brief orientation tour, visiting a few sights before a technical visit this afternoon. We will arrive at the hotel late afternoon for some free time before dinner at your hotel this evening.

Saturday, October 11: Madrid

This morning we will learn the history and culture of Madrid from a local guide while enjoying a walking tour. The tour combines a walking tour through the old quarter of Madrid: Major Square, Baja Street and a visit to the Royal Palace. Built during the 18th Century, the Royal Palace and is housed in the building of the old Alcázar of Madrid. It is one of the richest in Europe and is very well preserved. It is used by the Spanish Crown in Official Receptions, Presentation of Credentials and Official Events, such as State Meetings. Its rooms are full of artistic works belonging to the Royal Family. After lunch, we will have one last technical visit before returning to the hotel for a farewell dinner at a local restaurant.

Sunday, October 12: Depart for U.S.

Our Spanish tour comes to an end today. We will head to the airport after breakfast for our late morning flight back to Chicago and motorcoach to Madison.

Citizenship: Travelers must possess a passport that is valid for at least six months beyond tour dates. <u>Your name on tour documents and airline tickets must match your passport exactly.</u>

Cancellations, Refunds: All cancellations must be made in writing and are subject to a \$50 Burkhalter service fee. In addition to the service fee, cancellation penalties are:

- * Now through June 30, 2014: Deposit is refundable.
- * July 1 August 8, 2014: Deposit is non-refundable.
- * After August 9, 2014: Tour is non-refundable.

Travel Insurance: Cancellation/travel insurance is highly recommended and should be purchased at the time of deposit.
