MINUTES OF METHWOLD PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD AT ST. GEORGE'S HALL THURSDAY 8TH SEPTEMBER 2011

OPEN FORUM

- Mrs J Oliver has been researching the possibility of establishing a community composting scheme. This has been mentioned to the Open Spaces Working Party. The Parish Council has also been contacted by Rachel Stewart, Norfolk County Council Waste Reduction Officer, who is offering to visit parish councils to discuss waste reduction and recycling options. A date will be set for Rachel to visit the parish.
 - It was noted that meetings of the Hall and General Purposes Working Party are to be held on the third Monday of each month and the Open Spaces Working Party will be held every fourth Thursday of the month. The public are invited to attend these meetings and notes from the meetings are available at the monthly Parish Council meeting and to anyone who requests a copy.
 - Bushes are still hanging over the footpath at 28 Hythe Road, Methwold. A letter has been sent to the occupiers asking that the bushes be cut back.
 - It was noted that there have been numerous complaints regarding new residents of New Road, Methwold Hythe. The Police and Freebridge Housing Association are aware of issues.

<u>1. Apologies for Absence:</u>

2. No Declarations of Interest made.

3. The Minutes of the meeting held on 11/08/11 were agreed as a true record of the meeting with the following amendment:

The wording of item 4, paragraph 2, first sentence was altered to read 'it was proposed and agreed by a majority.....'.

4. Matters arising from past minutes:

• It was noted that the area by 1 Globe Street is included on the Parish Council's grass cutting contract and that it has now been mowed.

5. Reports:

5.1 Chairman's Report:

- Councillors were presented with minutes from the Finance Committee meeting held on 31/08/11, income and expenditure sheets and a copy of the 2011 budget. A general discussion had taken place at the finance meeting regarding the 2012 budget and the allocation of reserve money. It was suggested the working parties should consider what expenditure might be incurred by projects in the next financial year. The Full Council will decide on the precept request at a future meeting when it has been further considered what is to be undertaken by the Parish Council in 2012. A decision regarding the 2012 precept request will need to be made at the December meeting of the Parish Council.
- Planning application 11/01302/F, single storey side/rear extension at 7 Ventura Close, was considered at the Finance Committee meeting as a response was requested before 30 August 2011. It was agreed that the Parish Council would support the application.
- A memorial to Mr and Mrs Depledge which was positioned in the pathway between graves at Methwold Cemetery has been removed by the Parish Council. The family has been advised of this and a letter has been received from Mr. M Depledge in response. The Chairman, Mrs M Wortley and the Clerk will draft a reply to answer points raised in the letter.
- Mr J Marriage was thanked for installing a new water pipe at Methwold Cemetery. As the work was completed under the estimated budget Mr. Marriage suggested hooks should be provided at each tap to hang water containers. This matter will be an agenda item for the October Parish Council meeting.

5.2 Clerk's Report:

- It was noted that four girls had been seen on the roof of the Fenton Room before the Parish Council meeting. Consideration will be given to how this problem can be addressed.
- Highway Engineer, Andy Wallace, met the Clerk and Mr Ashman to consider the erection of signs by the Green Man warning of children playing. Two signs will be put up each side of the Green Man. Mr Wallace also looked at overgrown hedges along Thornham Road and Highways will approach owners regarding trimming of the hedges.
- The Clerk is to attend the Society of Local Council Clerks Regional Confer-

Conference to be held at Dunston Hall, Norwich on September 14th 2011.

• The Annual Play Equipment inspection has taken place and the overall comment was that the risk assessment of the equipment was recorded as very low risk.

5.3 Reports from Working Party meetings:

a) Recommendations made by the Open Spaces Working Party regarding facilities at Methwold Recreation Ground

Councillors had previously been presented with copies of the notes from the Working Party meeting held on 25th August 2011 and of the initial report regarding changing facilities at the Recreation Ground.

Councillors are to consult with parents and students at the village schools to gauge the demand for further play equipment to be provided at the Rec. Play equipment suppliers will be approached for quotes for new equipment and advice regarding sourcing grant funding. It is planned to invite three companies to a meeting of the Open Spaces Working Party so it can be seen what equipment they have to offer.

Parents in Methwold Hythe have requested a play area for the Hythe. However, a play area cannot be provided in Methwold Hythe on the land originally considered for this purpose as the land is presently part of an agricultural set aside scheme. A further possible location is being researched.

Discussion has also taken place regarding provision of changing facilities at the Rec. and it was decided to accept the following recommendations made by the Open Spaces Working Party

- 1. That the Group should ask for a Pre-Planning Consultation from the Borough Council and if the results of this are satisfactory then-
- 2. Draw up detailed plans and submit a formal planning application for a steelframed building on the existing site (or one slightly larger if footings have to be put around the existing slab). If this is passed then –
- 3. Apply for the first phase of Building Regulations which will indicate exactly what work will be needed so accurate estimates can be obtained.
- 4. At this stage a more precise estimation of cost for the project can be provided and public consultation can be undertaken
- 5. Following public consultation the Council can decide if the project should be continued

It was agreed by nine votes in favour (1 abstention) to accept these recommendations to undertake a feasibility study at a cost of £1400.

b) Purchase of seats

It was agreed by all that three wooden seats will be purchased to be located in the parish; one at Brookville, one outside the Post Office and one at the Recreation Ground. The total cost to be £1250 (seats £350 each plus fixing in place and the cost of preparing the ground at Brookville).

Other items discussed by the Working Party included the possible provision of a footpath display board and matters relating to the Churchyard. The Church will be asked to confirm that maintenance of the memorial garden in the Churchyard is the responsibility of the Parish Council. A request will be published in Methwold Times for householders to trim back greenery that is overhanging the footpath.

Draft questionnaire regarding refurbishment of the Fenton Room kitchen Councillors were presented with a suggested questionnaire relating to possible refurbishment work at St. George's Hall. Following suggested amendments being accepted the questionnaire will be distributed through the Methwold Times.

The General Purposes Working Party is researching the cost of gravel for the Cemetery and re-lining of St. George's Hall car park. Re-lining of the car park will be an agenda item for the October Parish Council meeting. Arrangements have been made for volunteers to sweep the Village Hall car park. Thanks were expressed to Councillors who have lowered the kitchen hatch at the Fenton Room.

5.4 The post box in Crown Street has still not been re-located to outside the Post Office as requested. Royal Mail will be contacted again.

6.1 Wayleave for Village sub-station

It was decided not to engage a land agent to research the possibility of receiving additional back rent for the location of the sub-station adjacent to the Churchyard as advice has been received that the Parish Council would not receive any back payment.

UK Power Networks Wayleave Surveyor, Paul Hurst, will be asked to visit the site to meet with Councillors regarding the future lease of the area for the sub-station. He will be asked to provide a copy of a standard lease for a sub-station. It is possible the size of the area rented may be larger than stated by Power Networks and enquiries will be made as to whether the access area is included in the wayleave agreement.

6.2 Purchase of dog waste bins for Methwold Hythe
It was agreed to purchase two dog waste bins and posts at a cost of £124.85
each. Mr. P Ashman offered to install the bins at the previously agreed locations in Methwold Hythe.

6.3 6.3 Mapping software

Following a presentation given to the Parish Council at the training evening held on July 26th consideration was given to purchasing mapping software for the parish. However, as only two councillors felt they would make use of the software it was decided not to consider purchase at this time.

11. Further reports/items for the next agenda:

- 11.1 Mr PAshman is to meet parents of children in Methwold Hythe regarding the possible provision of a play area in the Hythe. Land has been suggested which could be used as a play area but, as noted in item 5, it appears unlikely at present that the Parish Council would be offered a lease on the land.
- 11.2 The Scouts are attempting to raise money to renovate the Scout Hut at Brookville. It was asked if the Parish Council would make a donation to the renovation. Grant policy will be considered at the October meeting of the Parish Council.
- 11.3 It was noted that the Recreation Ground car park would benefit from resurfacing and white lining. Tree roots are causing damage to the tarmac and this would need to be addressed if resurfacing were to be undertaken.
- 11.4 The Post Office security gate needs maintenance.
- 11.5 It was agreed Mr Colin Marsland should be thanked for providing the Methwold web page for so many years.
- 11.6 Consideration will be given to planting a tree to celebrate the Queen's Jubilee. This will be an agenda item for the October Parish Council meeting and Councillors were asked to suggest possible locations for a tree. It was noted that the times of the Doctors surgery are not displayed at St.
- 11.7 George's Hall. Dates and times will be obtained and posted on the Fenton Room door.

WHAT DOES THE DOCTOR THINK THIS MONTH?

Where do I come from: Recently, I prepared a lecture about my Great, Great Uncle, Sir James Young Simpson, an eminent obstetrician in Edinburgh in the mid 1800's who pioneered the use of chloroform in labour. At that time, the prevailing view was that women should suffer during childbirth – "pain is therapeutic – how can a woman love a child for whom she has not suffered?" – etc. Sir James though this attitude appalling and his search for pain-free labour made him many enemies in the medical establishment. It also gained him Queen Victoria's patronage and a thriving obstetric practice, treating those pregnant ladies who did not subscribe to the above opinion!

I then dug out my family motto, coat of arms and the origins of the name Nisbet and all went well for a time. The Nisbets hail from the lowlands of Scotland and parts of Berwickshire. We can trace the line back to 1073 and, in the 12th century, the Nisbets built two castles, since gone. Nisbet House, built in the 1630s, still stands (in private ownership)at Duns in Berwickshire, quite near the village of Nisbet. The motto, "I Byd It" counsels patience and fortitude in times of stress, anxiety and neglect, and the bearing without complaint of such burdens as may fall upon those entitled to use the motto. The coat of arms features 3 boars' heads, (the boar is a symbol of bravery and perseverance) Sable(constancy) and Argent (peace and sincerity).

So far, so good. I can identify with the above – Castle owners, patience and fortitude in times of stress, anxiety and neglect, bearing burdens without complaint, bravery, perseverance, constancy, peace and sincerity – that's me all over! Happily, Head Office tends not to read these articles as, Heaven forfend, she may disagree with my assessment; I shall try to get this article to the publishers before she has a chance to interject.

It all went a bit pear-shaped when I came to the origin of the name Nisbet. It would appear that the name comes from the Old Norse "ness", meaning "nose" and "bit", meaning "mouthful". Try as I can, I cannot make anything remotely pleasant or self aggrandising out of that. OK, we do tend to have big noses and, very occasionally, someone might receive a mouthful if they really upset me. So far as I know, my ancestors were not in the habit of biting off mouthfuls of their enemies' noses and we certainly never talk with our mouths full! I suspect that the motto, suggesting endurance in the face of people taking the mick, may have been born out of frustration at being called "big-nosed mouthy types" by the early Nisbets' acquaintances and enemies. I would be most grateful if none of you could mention this name business to Management as she has, of course, become a Nisbet by marriage.

Craning your neck

Here at Lakenheath Fen, the team have spent a lot of time over the last four years talking about the trials and tribulations of the two pairs of cranes that arrived here in 2007. You may wonder though, what is the future of these regal birds in the Fens?

Well, the future is looking very bright indeed if I may say so myself! As I have previously reported, three young cranes have fledged on the reserve in the last three years. Additionally, you may not know that two cranes have been fledged in the last two years at a site on the western edge of the Fens.

This has led us to a glorious time when as I write in late September, there are a total of 14 cranes in the Fens. This motley crew consists of adults, juveniles from previous years and a few associated hangers on. They seem to be quite happy in the area. Let's hope they stick around!

Back here at Lakenheath Fen, it is hoped that one day, another pair of cranes will move in. There is certainly room for them, but whether our residents will tolerate them is another matter, as they are very territorial! In the immediate future though, the first priority is to make sure we have the best possible habitat for the birds that are already here.

I am very pleased to announce that we have recently been given a massive helping hand towards achieving this goal. We have received an extremely generous £5,000 grant by the BBC Wildlife Fund to "help to re-establish the crane in the East Anglian Fens."

This money will be used to recreate nine hectares of damp meadowland habitat on the Norfolk side of the river Little Ouse. This will provide ideal feeding habitat for our birds that is close to their nesting areas. The fundamental aim is to maintain and increase the current population of resident cranes, from two pairs and three young to a minimum of three pairs and further young by the 2013 breeding season. Sounds good to me!

If you would like to learn more about these fantastic birds and their history in Britain, you may be interested in the talk "Cranes in Britain" on Sunday November 6 11am-12pm. We hope to see you there!



Hospital Happenings November 2011 Monthly Ramblings about West Suffolk Hospital

New Equipment:

The West Suffolk Hospital Breast Imaging department is about to move into the digital age!

Building work to install a new digital mammography room and to replace the two existing rooms with digital equipment commenced on the 3rd October. This work will take approximately four months and we hope to have all three rooms and a new mobile Breast Screening unit fully installed by the beginning of February.

We anticipate minimal disruption to the service while this work is taking place, and every effort will be made to minimise noise and disturbance while the contractors are site.

This is a very exciting time for the Breast Imaging service and we would like to thank everyone for their support during the work.

Pay and Pensions:

Whilst not only a West Suffolk issue, but a national one, the issue of pay and pensions is a hot topic in the staff rooms. The so called gold plated pension is for NHS staff something which we have paid into for many years. Indeed, nearly a quarter of my pay is going to my pension.

This autumn there will be items in the news and a ballot for industrial action in the NHS. For the first time since its inception in 2005 the managers are also being asked to take part in a ballot too. I'll keep an eye on progress and report back if the situation develops further. Suffice it to say that nobody in the NHS wants to see industrial action affecting patient care so we hope the matter can be resolved.

Case of the Month:

Got a pacemaker? If you have you'll know that they are pretty sophisticated these days. Some are even able to deliver a shock if the heart should stop. This month's case involves an elderly patient from another hospital who had a very clever pacemaker fitted a while back. He came to us last month for a heart scan with a story of a mal-functioning pacemaker. This seemed pretty unlikely so I looked into it.

It seems that some people have a heart that misses a couple of beats and a normal

beat. However, studies have shown that hearts do better if they are allowed to skip a beat or two and so the new pacemakers ignore up to two missing beats. Our patient this month noticed that he was missing a couple of beats and presented himself to an A&E dept on a busy Saturday night. Accident department staff are not pacemaker experts and amidst the usual chaos of a gathering of very merry patients they immediately decided that a specialist heart centre would be the best place for him. On arrival it was determined that the pacemaker was functioning perfectly normally. They assessed the patient's condition(s) and with a big sigh, reset his pacemaker to avoid the future distress of missed beats.

A SNAPSHOT OF METHWOLD SCHOOL IN THE WAR YEARS 1940 - 45

(This follows on from the account of 1939 a few issues ago! The content is taken from the school log books of the time) - continued from October Issue

The Curriculum – Very little is recorded about the curriculum beyond the usual round of events. All the subjects taught in 1939 were still in evidence although there is a mention of French books in 1942. Inspectors, both local and HMI, called regularly and the Diocesan Inspector made special efforts to talk to the children and give advice on Scripture. Cookery & woodwork were still carried out at the Primative Methodist Chapel where time had to be shared with other local schools. Needlework, drawing and some geography still featured and the school was pleased to receive a gift, from Mr Morris of Dyke House, of rain gauges, thermometers and other weather-measuring equipment. New games such as shinty were introduced by the PE Organiser and by 1945 cricket, rounders, shinty and football all appear to have been played regularly.

Scholarship exams were taken every March / April throughout the period with successful candidates going on to Downham Market. Only two or three a year appear to have been given this opportunity. It is perhaps surprising that the Education Act of 1944 is not commented on at all in the log book but there is a brief mention in 1945 of an examination being conducted in connection King's Lynn Grammar School.

Health -

* Regular inspections of children's development were carried out by the school nurse and also by doctors. Teeth (In 1940 treatment involved 68 children who were subject to 142 extractions and 71 fillings!!!), general health, eye, headlice & throat inspections were carried out regularly.

Poor living conditions in one home in particular were noted by the Headmaster and followed up by the nurse, as many health issues were.

Illnesses regularly included: German Measles, impetigo, ringworm, measles, coughs & colds, influenza, bronchitis, bronchial catarrh (staff member), phlebitis (staff member), tonsillitis and scabies.

Needy children were given free hot meals

Children were given milk – but the supply from a local farm was erratic and delivered too late. The Headmaster protested that 150 bottles were needed before 9.30pm ! By the end of 1941 about 190 pupils were receiving free milk.

War Issues :

• Respirators continued to be checked regularly and new face pieces given out if necessary. Drills were regular too.

- May "Owing to the intense activities of the war in Holland and Belgium instructions were received on the wireless for all schools to open on Tuesday (a day later than planned)

- A four week course of "War Time Cookery" was held for parents.
- School precautions in the event of an air-raid were again inspected and it was suggested that the cloakrooms be used as shelters. Accordingly strips of paper were put across the windows and wire netting over some so that they would be more shatterproof. On an exercise pupils were found to be in position within a minute!
- June All the school windows were covered with strips of paper and those in the infants area were covered with wire netting.
- June 19th Only 153 present probably due to the effects of an air-raid during the night.
- July No pupils were sent from Northwold for cookery because of air-raid alarms.

1941 – Gas van came to test respirator masks. This happened throughout the rest of the war.

1942 – Capt Matthews (RN) gave a talk about "Convoy Work."

1943 – Circular from Office on "Dangerous Military Objects" – children warned! 1944 War Time Cookery demonstration given by The Electricity supply Co. May 44 – School held a 'Salute The Soldier' week, aiming to raise £100. Their final total was £117.17.3d !

By 1945 less and less was being recorded in the school log book beyond the general round of coal deliveries, medical examinations, inspectors calling and the day to day routine of the school. Things gradually got back to normal, the netting was removed from the windows and the school redecorated. Mr Doughty returned to work in 1946 after being demobbed by the RAF but soon left to take up a Headship. All in all the school looks as if it got through the war years very well considering what was going on around them.

METHWOLD PARISH COUNCIL VILLAGE SEATS

Walking around Methwold, Methwold Hythe & Brookville is always a delight but sometimes the opportunity to sit down is much appreciated. Sadly some of our village seats are in need of repair or replacement and there is a good case for a few additions. The Open Spaces Group on the Parish Council has considered this matter recently and as a result Council has agreed to purchase three new seats and place them in Brookville, Methwold Recreation Ground and outside the Post Office. We would like to do more and will be looking at an on-going programme of repair, repainting and replacement. This may take a number of years to achieve unless we can raise funds in the community

Would You or Your Family Like To Sponsor A New Village Seat? The Parish Council has agreed to this scheme which it hopes will speed up the replacement of village seats :

- Individuals or families may sponsor the replacement of a village seat or establish a seat in a new position provided that the position is approved by the Parish Council and any other body which has authority over public areas eg. The Highways Dept of Norfolk C.C. at a cost of £400. (This covers the cost of a new quality wooden seat and its positioning) People may sponsor half a seat at the cost of £200 and thus share the
- total cost with another individual or family. People sponsoring seats may provide a plaque to dedicate the seat in
- memory of a loved one or to indicate who has donated the seat. Alternatively seats may be sponsored anonymously. The nature ,size and content of the plaque will need to be approved by the Parish Council and this will be done through discussion with the sponsor. Seats which have been sponsored by two individuals/families will carry two dedication plaques.

The Parish Council has decided that it will not allow plaques on the

seats outside the Post Office or next to the RAF memorial.
