

Convention Notes

Hotel The former Holiday Inn has been completely re-done since we were there in 2004 and is now the Crowne Plaza. Look for these changes - a beautiful modern lobby and a new Atrium Exposition and Conference Center with 11,000 sq. ft. of flexible space; Northern Lights is the modern new restaurant; all double rooms converted to 2 queen size beds.

Registration Please use the appropriate registration form. Board members, delegates, and Young Women Reps have specially identified forms with earlier due dates. **All others**, including exhibitors and teens, use the GUEST form, included here, due September 1, after which a late fee applies. Emergency information will go on the back of the name badge. Teens 13-17 need a parent's signature.

† LINC-Baltimore "Wonderfully Made" program helps educate families in the inner city areas of Baltimore on child care. Bring infant and toddler needs, such as formula, diapers, wipes, cream, and clothing up to 4T. Gently used clothing is acceptable, but no stains, please.

† Lutheran Mission Society's Southern MD Compassion Center— with winter coming soon there will be a need for heavy socks and underwear for men, women and children. Items should be new, preferably packaged. Please do not bring dress socks. Opaque tights are acceptable for children.



At convention, we will be voting to replace the current bylaw document with the proposed new document after consideration is given to any substantial amendments to the new document.
