Course Description

In this unique course, stimulating didactic sessions will provide updates of important topics in women's health. Important issues related to the practice of obstetrics and gynecology in contemporary society will be addressed. This is a family friendly course with specific sessions that should be of interest to spouses/partners of physicians with a focus on finding a balance between a fulfilling personal life and a rewarding professional career.

Learning Objectives

After attending this course, the participant should be able to:

- Discuss current and future challenges in healthcare reform, understanding ACOG's advocacy issues for women's health care access and our Fellow's practice support.
- Discuss the effects of health care legislation nationally and within Texas from recent legislative sessions.
- Discuss the evaluation and treatment of the perimenopausal patient including the use of birth control versus hormone replacement, including appropriate screening tests, reviewing special issues in this group of patients.
- Review ureteral anatomy, and describe peripheral nerve anatomy and perineal anatomy with clinical correlations.
- Review current screening and diagnostic tests for cancer in women, and discuss recommended treatment options.
- Understand the scope of early term deliveries and complications associated with elective early term delivery and learn resources designed to decrease rates of elective late term delivery.
- Review the patient safety program, "Team-STEPPS" developed by the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) and apply to office practice.
- Review the basic science behind vulvodynia and discuss the new classification system for vulvar pain syndromes.
- Describe the epidemiology and disease burden of pertussis in young infants and recommended preventative strategies, including targeted immunization strategies.
- Describe the impact of STDs in the US and discuss the importance of the 2010 STD Treatment Guidelines, and discuss antimicrobial resistance in gonorrhea and other STDs.
- Understand current trends of collaborative practice in women's health care and be familiar with current collaborative practice models.
- Apply principles of building and strengthening interpersonal relationships and review their importance to your personal success.
