## ARTIFACT INSTRUCTION SHEET

Every group will create four artifacts (one per person). The choices are:

- 1. Diary
- 2. Letter
- 3. Lyrics (music)
- 4. Map
- 5. Newspaper Article
- 6. News Report
- 7. Pamphlet
- 8. Photographs
- 9. Poem
- 10. Political Cartoon
- 11. Postcard
- 12. Protest Poster (sign or button)
- 13. Readers' Theater
- 14. Scrapbook
- 15. Timeline

Each artifact must include the following elements:

- The perspective of an African American living during YOUR assigned time period.
  - Your artifact must reflect the person's life experiences and a sense of the time in which the person lived (For example, Reconstruction Era, World War I, Great Depression, etc.).
  - > Your artifact must be accurate in its coverage of the issues.
  - > Your artifact must in some way address or reflect the essential questions:
    - 1. What were some effects of slavery and segregation in society?
    - 2. How did the African American struggle for equality become a mass movement?
    - 3. How did the law support or HINDER the struggle for equality for African Americans?
    - 4. Has equality for African Americans truly been achieved today?
  - Your artifact may be related to or may be an extension of the photos, text documents, maps, etc. that you explore on the Library of Congress' African American Odyssey Exhibit.
- Your artifact must be colorful, creative, and authentic-looking.
- Your artifact must be neat and of high quality.
- If it is a written artifact, it must contain proper grammar and spelling.
- You will orally present your artifact to the rest of the class.
