

# Uno - May 2001 - June 2013

Uno was Oasis's first rescue. In October 2001, Pam and Phyllis were searching for a new farm to board Phyllis's horse, and they came upon a facility in Franklinville, NJ. Four little nameless kittens approximately 5 months old were running about; all except for one bony, dirty little gray female. She could not run well at all. She had a very deformed front leg but wow! - could she try to climb up your pants leg to be held! The other kittens sometimes kept her away from their community food bowl, so she was very thin. The farm owner said she had no use for that little kitten, who was unable to catch mice and had a hard time getting out of the way of the horses. The kitten struggled to follow Pam and Phyllis, yowling at them when they tried to move away from her. Phyllis picked her up and the little one snuggled in her arms, not wanting to be put back down. When the owner said she was planning to shoot the cat because she felt "it" was useless and did not want her to reproduce, Pam & Phyllis knew they had to take her. The owner agreed to pay \$10 co-pays for the kittens to be sterilized, all except for the "useless" one. Pam and Phyllis took all four kittens to be spayed and neutered; the owner

refused to take any of them back. They were all adopted out to good homes, and Uno was adopted by Pam's sister. Uno, (a/k/a Luna) had a wonderful life with a real family; always inside in a warm comfortable home with plenty of love, food, toys, feline buddies, and vet care. Uno was humanely euthanized in mid June since she had inoperable cancer and was beginning to suffer. We wish Uno well on the next leg of her journey. She is missed by those who love her.

### DID YOU KNOW?

Summer is here and gardens are places of sheer beauty, and serious toxins. Some plants are poisonous to pets if ingested and will make them ill; some can even be deadly. The following is a partial list of poisonous plants; for more information please check the websites for the HSUS (Human Society of the United States) or the ASP-CA (American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals).

**American Holly** (berries) **Autumn Crocus** Azalea **Beech Trees Bleeding Hearts** (leaves & roots) **Buttercups** (toxic to horses) Cyclamen Hyacinth, Daffodil and Tulip Bulbs Hydrangea Kalanchoe **Lillies** (also toxic to horses!) Lilly of the Valley Oleander **Peonies** (flowers & roots) Rhododendron Sago Palm St. John's Wort Wisteria (flowers & pods) **Yews** - all types

Let's not forget about fertilizers, herbicides and pesticides many of us use to keep our gardens green, growing and pest free. Please remember to keep pest baits, blood meal, bone meal, and all chemicals away from your pets – including gasoline for your lawn equipment and chemicals for your pool!
