# The Compost Crew Pilot Program Update

In late December 2013, 24 Maplewood households began a 3 month pilot program of food-waste recycling with Wednesday curbside pick up by the Compost Crew. The 3 month pilot program fee was \$35. The 24 households represent Acacia Ave, Alta Vista Ct, Alta Vista Rd, Alta Vista Terrace, Bardon Rd, Benton Ave, Chandler St, Corsica Dr, Cypress Ave, Danbury Ct, Elsmere Ave, Holland Ave, Linden Ave, Locust Ave, Milroy Pl, Page Ave, Wickett Terrace and Wildoak Dr.

Maplewood's initial pilot program registration was similar to that of other Bethesda neighborhoods including The Town of Chevy Chase which finally reached upwards of 50 households. The Compost Crew food waste composting service is now included in the city services that The Town of Chevy Chase provides for all its residents.

With Maplewood's pilot program ending approximately March 18, 2014 Maplewood pilot program participants are set to continue to receive the Compost Crew services at a 50% discount off its regular charge of \$32 per month which will be \$16 per month.

At Maplewood's request, the Compost Crew has agreed to allow residents not already signed up for Maplewood's pilot program to sign up for the time remaining for \$25. Participation in the pilot program ensures a 50% discounted monthly fee of \$16 after the pilot program ends; for Maplewood residents not participating in the pilot program the monthly fee will be the regular \$32 per month fee.

## MCA Creates An Additional Listserv – "Nextdoor"

MCA has established a Nextdoor listserv to complement our MCA listserv (Maplewoodcitizens@yahoogroups.com). There are similarities and differences between the two.

Once you verify your address and sign up for the site using your real name, you have access to a neighborhood directory, map, events, marketplace ("buy," "sell," and "free") and local service recommendations like "great babysitter" or nearby resources such as veterinarians, dentists, schools, country clubs, and churches. Nextdoor can also serve as an area "blotter" to report and share news about break-ins or suspicious activity.

You can choose how much information you want to disclose on your personal profile (e-mail address, work and/or home phone, or street name instead of exact address.) Members may also be contacted through private messages via their profile pages. Personal e-mail addresses do not have to be revealed. You may also choose whether to receive information from other nearby communities that have Nextdoor listservs such as Wyngate.

Nextdoor has several ways to verify that new members actually live in the Maplewood. A postcard may be sent to a new member's address with a special code to be plugged into Nextdoor.com. Once you've logged in, you will be asked to confirm your account. Signing up with a home phone number or credit card linked to a home address also works as verification. Alternatively, verified neighbors can invite other neighbors to join by sending an official postcard or flyer from Nextdoor.

# The Purple Line

The 16 mile Purple Line timetable proceeds with the approval of Maryland's Governor. Montgomerv and Prince Georges County Executives and their County Councils. The Purple Line is the only east-west rapid transit line that will connect Bethesda in Montgomery County to New Carrollton in Prince Georges County, The Purple Line connects METRO's Red, Green, Orange and Blue lines as well the MARC lines to Baltimore with 21 stations. The Maryland Transportation Authority expects the Purple Line to carry some 76,000 riders a day making stops at new stations in Bethesda, Chevy Chase, Silver Spring, College Park and New Carrollton with three stops at the University of Maryland. The Purple Line trains will carry up to 200 passengers in streamline

cars with emphasis on passenger comfort, convenience and access. Currently, after reviewing dozens of proposals, the State of Maryland is down to choosing one of four public-private consortiums to design, build, operate, maintain and help finance construction of the \$2.2 billion light rail project.
