MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH UPDATE

The Montgomery County police know that as days become warmer and longer all kinds of people start roaming neighborhoods for a variety of purposes. When "visitors" come calling, remembering a couple of facts can help you deal with the situation.

- If an unknown or unexpected solicitor knocks at your door, engage the person in whatever manner is most comfortable for you. Responding, even to a potential burglar, lets the solicitor know that the home is occupied. Even talking through the door will likely cause the solicitor to move elsewhere. If you are not comfortable talking with strangers, stand behind the door saying: "Whatever you're selling or offering, no thanks; I'm not interested." The vast majority of solicitors will look elsewhere.
- 2. If the solicitor persists, the police suggest your next comment should be: "The police have been contacted and will be here shortly to help you!" 301-279-8000 is Montgomery County's non-emergency number for such incidents. Officer Dana Stroman, Maplewood's police liaison, encourages residents to use that number to report anyone acting suspiciously. Montgomery County police want to learn who may be "casing out" neighborhoods. Furthermore, the police don't mind responding to aggressive solicitors who inevitability are breaking the law by not having complied with the requirements of the County's Office of Permitting Services.

Richard Kanehl has kindly accepted the duties of Maplewood's Neighborhood Watch Coordinator. Richard is seeking volunteer block captains to assist with disseminating occasional safety and security information of possible interest to the approximately ten nearby residents on their block. HEART HOUSE DEVELOPMENT

On April 11, 2013, the Montgomery County Planning Board approved the development plan to construct twentynine single-family houses and five Moderately Priced Dwelling Units (MPDUs) on the Heart House property (formerly known as the American College of Cardiology). Destruction of the existing building will begin soon, followed by clearing the land. The property developer will attend the May 15th meeting to

detail the development time line and to answer questions from residents about the impact of these activities on the surrounding area.
