# OSLC is Changing. God's Steadfast Love Remains!

The ancient Greek philosopher, Heraclitus, famously wrote that the only real constant in life is change. Biblical wisdom has its own take on the human experience of the ever-shifting sands beneath our feet. God's Word acknowledges this truth of constant change, but it also holds to a second certainty. In addition to change, the other constant in our life is God's steadfast love. And, it is God's steadfast love that will reveal what OSLC is to become in the days ahead.

To ground our sense of the changes happening in our wider community, consider the following facts:

- →In the last twenty years, the population of Issaquah has basically quadrupled growing from around 8,400 to over 33,000.
- →Starting in 1996, the Issaquah Highlands and Talus were developed by the city as "Urban Villages." These new developments account for about a third of the total population and a large amount of new population growth.
- →From 2000 to 2010, census data shows that while the number of residents identified as "White" grew by 131%, growth for non-white residents was far more explosive: 686% for "Asian," 326% for "Black," 279% for "Two or more races," and 241% for "Other race."
- →From 2000 to 2010, census data shows a dramatic shift in the average age of Issaquah residents. In this decade, the population for those "65 years and over" grew by 46%, while it grew by 86% for those "18 to 64 years," and 171% for those "0 to 4 years."

Census data largely confirms what we already know if we look around while shopping at Costco and Fred Meyer or if we volunteer in local school classrooms. Youth and increasing cultural diversity are at the heart of change in Issaquah.

And, this is where it gets exciting for us, as a faith community. Down through the ages, clear eyed prophets and bold saints have helped God's people lean into God's steadfast love in the midst of change. Psalm 144 was written in a time of incredible changes for Israel both within and without. New languages were spoken, new leaders were emerging, and the future seemed to many to be uncertain. Trusting in God's steadfast love, the psalmist wrote:

I will sing a new song to you, O God; upon a ten-stringed harp I will play to you...

May our sons in their youth be like plants full grown, our daughters like corner pillars, cut for the building of a palace.

Embracing the steadfast love of the Lord in a changing world meant singing a new song and focusing on the vitality and stability that younger generations might bring to the community.

How might OSLC learn from our ancestors in the faith and lean into God's love in a time of change? How might we choose to sing a new song and seek out the vitality and stability that sons and daughters might bring?

These are questions for leaders in this community to answer and rally around together. In prayerful discernment, I believe that the answers most certainly include building up new ministries that target children, youth, and their families. I believe that God is calling us to dedicate more of our time, money, and listening to the diverse new peoples that are reshaping Issaquah. In worship, education, fellowship, outreach and every other area of our life together, this means making openness, experimentation, and listening to new voices a priority.

Join me in praying for the good changes that God is bringing to our faith community. If you haven't already, make a habit of listening to new voices in our congregation and in the wider community. Let your holy imagination wander and join the psalmist in beginning to write a new song to God.

# **Update – Transition Times and Preparing for Pastor Thomas' Retirement**

I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

~Ephesians 4:1-3

I was given some good advice the other day, from a pastor who has lived through transition and interim times. "The first thing to do is remain calm. The second thing is to listen. The third thing is to not forget the first two".

As we prepare to celebrate Pastor Thomas's retirement, and enter into our interim/transition period, I think this advice is solid and worth sharing. We are all facing times where patience and listening will be keys to our successful navigation. Staying calm is important. While we have God's guidance and the Bishop's support, we will be facing the challenges of helping voices to be heard while moving forward with a process that will be lengthy. Some may say that we should move quickly while others may prefer to take the time needed in our search for a new pastor. We are beginning a journey, one of self-discovery and learning, a time of reflection wherein we will invite the Holy Spirit to guide us. This time is not to be rushed, but rather savored, as we identify the needs and future directions of our congregation. During this time we will create a Ministry Site Profile (MSP), a picture of who we are as a congregation, along with areas for growth and development. This document will be the basis from which our Bishop will determine candidates for calling a pastor who will meet our needs and grow with us in God's name. We will follow the Synodical process for Pastoral Replacement. This document can be found on the Synod website (www.lutheransnw.org).

As president, I am and will continue to be in close contact with Bishop Unti and Assistant to the Bishop Pastor Buffum. The Bishop and Pastor Buffum have attended council meetings, and will continue to be available as we continue on our journey. I will bring updates each month in the FOCUS as well as posting information on the bulletin boards in Anderson Hall, in order to share important activities and progress. I do encourage anyone who feels the need, to contact myself or a council member, to share your voice and prayers, or to raise concerns as needed. Both council and staff are working to make this transition as easy as possible. Once we have an Interim Pastor in place, he or she will also be available for guidance and counsel.

We are encouraged through the Synodical process and by our Bishop to celebrate Pastor Thomas's retirement. The first and most important step at this time is to focus on saying a loving 'good bye!' to Pastor Thomas and Ann. Led by our Interim Choir Director and Worship Coordinator Scott Hafso, and our Parish Administrator Janet Heck, we are planning a celebration in Gratitude to God and in Thanksgiving for the Ministry of Larry and Ann Thomas. Through music, sharing memories and prayer, we will honor Pastor Larry and Ann and the twenty two years they have served us. More information regarding this November 9th celebration can be found in this FOCUS, and will also be sent out this month.




# **Sunday Morning Adult Class / Lectio Divina**

St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians October 5-26 @9:45 a.m.

Pastor Thomas will lead a four week Bible study/lectio divina experience on St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians. Philippians is Paul's happiest letter. In his introduction to Philippians in *The Message*, Eugene Peterson writes, "Before we've read a dozen lines, we begin to feel the joy ourselves - the dance of words and the exclamations of delight have a way of getting inside of us...When we read what Paul wrote to the Christian believers in the city of Philippi, we find ourselves in the company of a master. Paul doesn't tell us that we can be happy, or how to be happy. He simply and unmistakable *is* happy. None of his circumstances contribute to his joy: He wrote from a jail cell, his work was under attack by competitors, and after twenty years or so of hard traveling in the service of Jesus, he was tired and would have welcomed some relief. But circumstances are incidental compared to the life of Jesus, the Messiah, that Paul experiences from the inside." Each week participants will read, review and discuss one of the four chapters of Philippians. Each week we will devote a portion of our Bible study to lectio divina, a slow, contemplative experiential reading of a selected passage from the chapter for the week. Class will meet in the church library. Please join us.




