Confirmation and *Common Ground*

Our students dig into scripture and our Lutheran small catechism, learning and seeking the answers to our foundations of faith. 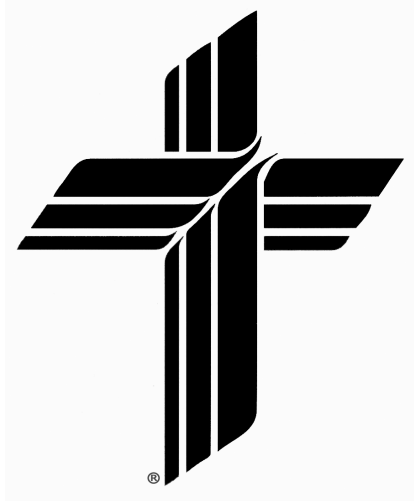
