



Cross Country Ontario is seeking female chaperone/apprentice coach interested attending the Ontario Ski Team's mid-summer dryland camp July 9-16, 2015 in Thunder Bay, ON. This training camp will be held in collaboration with NDC Thunder Bay and the Ontario Ski Team Contract Coach Andrew Casey.

Candidates must:

- Demonstrate a strong understanding of the training requirements of L2C athletes
- Have experience organizing and coordinating team activities.
- Have a valid driver's licence
- provide a current Police check, if not provided to CCO within the last 3 years

Responsibilities will include:

- assist in team travel and logistics
- assist in organizing and implementing the week's training plan.
- help team members set personal objectives
- supervise team members during stay
- ensure accommodation are left clean and tidy
- report any damage to accommodations to rental agency and CCO
- work with OST Contract Coach to achieve objectives
- write a trip report for the HPC
- submit any expenses within 2 weeks of return

Cross Country Ontario will pay all related trip expenses for the Apprentice Coach/Chaperone. Logistical/travel arrangements will be provided by Cross Country Ontario. A modest honorarium may be available.

Please note: Due to the nature of this training camp and the need to have both genders in a supervisory role, only female applicants will be considered for this position. The successful applicant will be required to live in student accommodations at Lakehead University.
